AUTHOR'S PREFACE.



IN launching this volume into the world of books, the Author's desire has been to present, in an artistic, clear, and concise manner, a descriptive and illustrated narrative of the City of Adelaide—otherwise known as “The Queen City of the South”—as the heart centre of the great State of South Australia, emphasising its principal public buildings, its leading business houses, and its tourists' attractions. Also to present in up to date authentic figures, and in plain brief language, the chief statistical conditions built up in the past history of the State, in its industrial, commercial, political, and civil development. All literary verbosity is excluded, and only such matter-of-fact language used as is in accord with a book whose absolute reliability is stamped upon every page by the unerring science of photography.

The Queen City of the South.

THE euphonious name attaching to our city was practically stamped upon it by King William IV., of England, when he commanded that the chief city of South Australia should bear the name of his consort, Adelaide.* This being the reigning king's command, it followed a natural sequence that queenly conditions should distinguish its foundations as nearly as possible, and that its future should so develop as to uphold its royal title and dignity.

The genius which both selected, planned, and laid out the site is evident everywhere. The late Colonel Light, on whom this work devolved, is justly immortalised by the bronze statue which stands upon a granite pedestal in the heart of the city, and by one of the small parks or city "squares" which bears his name.

The city well upholds the name—"Queen City of the South." It stands upon a slightly elevated plain on the south bank of the Torrens River, and has the striking advantage of natural surface drainage both east, west, south, and north.

Adelaide is laid out on a rectangular plan, and covers an area of about 1,042 square acres. It is surrounded by broad streets called "terraces," and are designated as North Terrace, South Terrace, East Terrace, and West Terrace. These delimit the city proper, and in order to protect and perpetuate

its integral characteristics, a spacious park in the shape of a hollow square, with a mean depth of about half a mile, circumlocates the whole. These park lands are decorated with well-grown umbrageous trees, both indigenous and exogenous, and are suitably provided with numerous seats, and are pervaded with well-kept gravel footpaths in every direction. The green lawns afford a boundless area upon which to indulge in public pastimes of every description, and as convenient pasturage they form no mean adjunct to the comfort of the citizens.

As a safety valve to the hygiene of the City of Adelaide, the park lands are of countless value.

It is almost impossible for an epidemic to get footing in Adelaide. This large unpopulated area, with its boundless tree foliage, acts as a natural respirator, absorbing the used-up city air and dispensing a bountiful supply of oxygen in its place.

These are indeed queenly conditions, and reflect the genius wisdom, and foresight of the man who shed so great a light upon them.

The city streets, too, in their spaciousness, construction, and maintenance, stand alone in the cities of Australia. The four terraces afford a four-mile residential frontage to spacious parks, and are well built upon all round, while their varied aspects offer a choice of residence at any point of the compass.

King William Street, named after the reigning Sovereign in 1837, is perhaps one of the finest and grandest streets in the world. It is two chains in width, running north and south, and divides the city into equal halves, popularly known as East Adelaide and West Adelaide. King William Street, too, introduces another unique peculiarity among the city streets of Australia. It is the starting point of every street running at right angles to it, whether eastward or westward. Although in continuous line, the name borne by the intersecting street is different on either side of King William Street. The house numbers, too, start at King William Street, and hence one must be struck with the peculiar grandeur and significance of this great artery of traffic. It is at first somewhat puzzling to visitors to realise that every street changes its name at King William Street, but upon closer familiarity both the wisdom and convenience of the arrangement are apparent.

There are other streets as wide as King William Street, and all of imposing appearance, such as Hutt Street, running north and south, and Wakefield Street, running east and west; but their majestic mission is wanting, and they are only admired as splendid residential thoroughfares.

QUITY SQUARES is a common-place name attached to a number of beautifully kept miniature parks within the city boundary.

The largest decorates the centre of the city and is named "Victoria Square," after our late most gracious queen before she ascended the throne. The others are—"Light," "Whitmore," "Hindmarsh," and "Hurtle." Named after Col. Wm. Light, first Surveyor-General of South Australia; W. Woolryche Whitmore, M.P., Colonisation Commissioner; Capt. Hindmarsh, R.N., first Governor of South Australia; and James

Hurtle Fisher, Colonisation Commissioner and Registrar. Each of these "squares" or parks is over an acre in extent, and is enclosed by an ornamental iron palisading fence, well studded with large shady trees, supplied with lazy-back seats and ornamented with flower beds. Across them at different angles are well-kept pathways to facilitate the ordinary city pedestrian traffic, and their grassy lawns not only make excellent play-grounds for children, but are refreshing resting places to the weary citizen after the enervating influences of the summer days. The same wisdom that planned the "squares" is also apparent in placing them in readily accessible centres, each one being in the centre of each of the four quarters of the city, and so act as safety valves for the escape of any possible accumulation of noxious gases in the most thickly populated localities.

To say that Adelaide is the cleanest city in the Commonwealth is almost superfluous. Every visitor, whether an Australasian traveller, or one from beyond the seas, is struck with the scrupulous cleanliness observable everywhere. Her roadways are clean, her street gutters are clean, and her footpaths are clean. In summer months pedestrians and shopkeepers join in bewailing an occasional

dust storm, but this arises from the quality of the metal used for Macadamising; it is the best available, but has not the resisting qualities of the blue metals of Melbourne and Sydney; still, the copious use of the water-cart reduces the unpleasantness to a minimum. The footpaths are wide and well kept, and are chiefly made of asphalt, though one half the length of King William Street can boast of slabs of well-chiselled granite. Spitting on footpaths is a civil offence, and foot passengers are expected to walk to the right.

It is naturally assumed by visitors that King William Street in its splendor and significance is the home of the retail shopkeeper, but such is only partial. In King William Street are the banks, most of the government offices, auctioneers, brokers, and some professional men, while Rundle Street, Gawler Place, and upper Hindley Street is the centre of the retail shopkeepers. Some of the retail houses in Rundle Street would be a credit to any city in the world. Their window displays not only bear evidence to the art of the window dresser, but testify very plainly that South Australian retail shopkeepers are up to date in commercial enterprise. Within the last year or two a marked development has taken place in Gouger St. near the Central City Markets. Retail shops are springing up here with great rapidity, and the wage-earning classes flock to this locality in thousands on Saturday evenings and part with much of their earnings. These changes appear to be part and parcel of the revolution of retail business in Australian cities. Melbourne has its Collingwood, Sydney has its Oxford Street and Brickfield Hill, and Brisbane has its Valley. North Terrace may be regarded as the home of the medical profession and the dentist, while wholesale warehouses, manufacturers, wine and spirit merchants, printers and publishers are promiscuously all over the city.

The Public Offices of Adelaide are nearly all located in King William Street. The Post and Telegraph Offices rank first in point of prominence, and boasts of a high tower, in which is built an excellent monitor of time, which punctually chimes the quarter-hours and peels out the hours with no uncertain sound. Nearly opposite the Post Office stands the Town Hall, a massive stone building with a huge tower and battlements and an imposing frontage abutting the roadway of King William Street. In close proximity is the Custom House, the Treasury, and the Lands Office, all splendid buildings, while other public offices make imposing offsets to Victoria Square.

THE Christian Brothers' College is situated in one of the quietest parts of the city within a few minutes' walk of the East Park Lands. Its site is quadrangular, the frontage extending for two hundred and seventy feet or so along Wakefield-street, with a depth of about one hundred and ninety feet. The class-rooms occupy the western side of the quadrangle. They are ten in number, and include a science-room, in which there is a good collection of chemical and physical apparatus. On the eastern side is the gymnasium, a fine hall fitted up with the most approved gymnastic appliances, and providing every facility for the physical development of the students. The playground is an extensive asphalted enclosure with a fine play-shed and ball-alley, which latter is not only used during playtime by the students, but is also largely availed of during non-school hours by old scholars, who love a good old national game.

The College Chapel is beautifully designed with ornaments and furniture in solemn and beautiful harmony with a House of Prayer. The dormitories are lofty airy apartments, with windows on three sides. Between them is the lavatory, with shower baths, etc., of the most approved kind.

The boarders' study or library is the largest room in the establishment. On certain times during the week the book-shelves are thrown open, and each student allowed to select something to read from a good collection of books, pious, historical, biographical, with a large number also of that kind which is most after a boy's own heart—books of adventure.



A COMPLETE system of underground drainage of large capacity receives and carries off by the force of a copious water supply all the sewerage and offal concomitants of the city, and discharges them some six miles away to the north-west, at a place called Dry Creek. Here it undergoes chemical purification, and is afterwards used as a fertilizer.

Perfect sanitary conditions necessarily imply the existence of a bountiful water supply, and of this the city proudly boasts. In its never-failing abundance of pure

water, Adelaide stands practically in the front among Australian cities. The costly and colossal engineering undertakings which gave Sydney and Melbourne their supplies have not been necessary here. The Mount Lofty Ranges, five miles away, offer an abundant supply of crystal streams. The most capacious reservoir lies to the south-east, about six miles from the city, and bears the name of Happy Valley. An extensive earthworks, well puddled with clay walls, back quite an expansive sheet of water, conveyed to this natural basin from the course of the Onkaparinga River, a distance of some 20 miles, by underground iron pipes of large dimensions. A second supply finds its volume from the

Torrens River, across which a stone weir has been thrown about 10 miles from the city, at a place called The Gorge. From the dam at this juncture the water is carried to various storage reservoirs, whence it gravitates to the city and suburbs. From the silvery, rushing, cataract known as Waterfall Gully a third supply is pressed into high level reservoirs and reticulates in all directions.

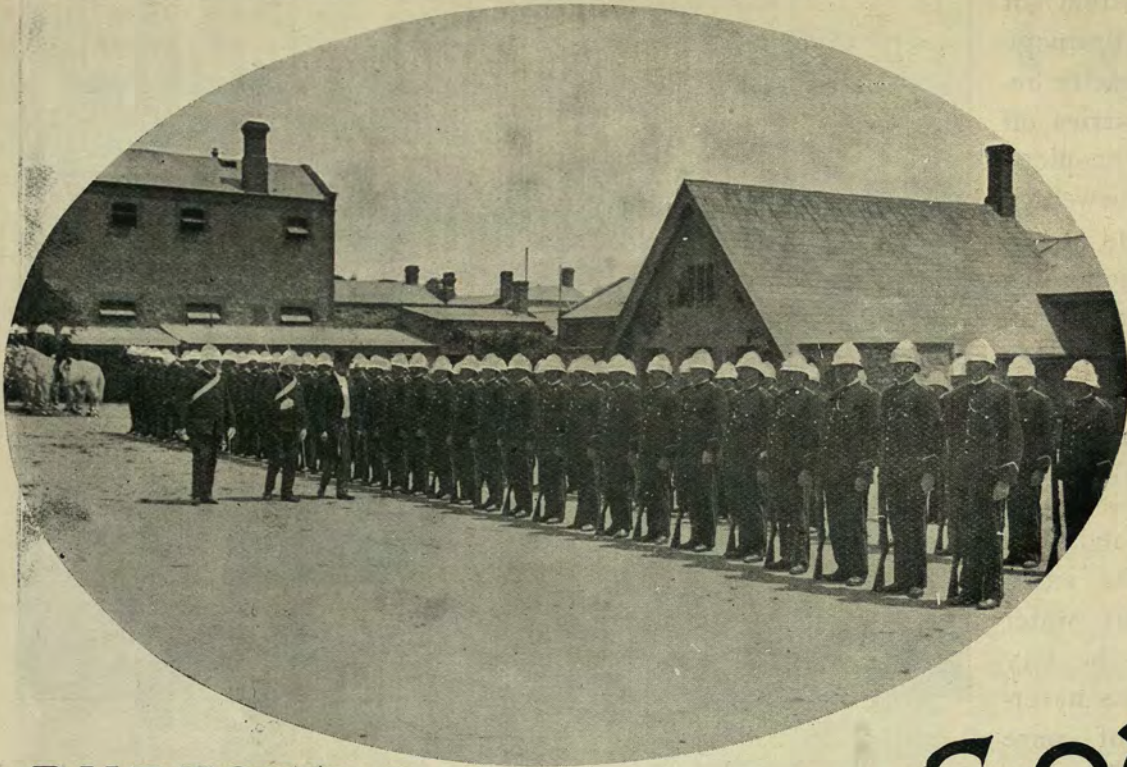

THE names "Gorge" and "Waterfall" are derived from the physical features of the country, but that of "Happy Valley" dates back as far as 1836, and is said to have arisen from a jolly picnic party which centred there in those early days.

Chemical analysis tells us that the water supply of Adelaide is a pure one. It would almost be impossible otherwise. The high altitude of the catchment area, and the absence of any possible source of pollution upon it, together with the clean gravelly surface of the country

over which it trickles, all conduce to its limpidity and purity. The turbid sediment sometimes apparent in it arises from an imperfection in its storage, or reticulation, and might easily be corrected.

The city streets and the parks are well supplied with drinking fountains and cups, and with drinking troughs for dumb animals.

A feature which also exists in the Adelaide water supply to a greater extent than in any other Australian City is its extensive application to the gardens and farms surrounding the metropolis.

Nearly every farmer and gardener has his irrigation scheme drawn through the common reticulation.

In passing we have briefly mentioned that the underground sewerage system of the city is nearly perfect. As a fitting accompaniment the same may be said of the surface drainage and street scavenging. A close inspection of storm water traps, cleanly swept streets, accurate levelling, and prompt oversight work well together to keep up the fair repute of the fair City; and visitors both from near and far are unanimous in their admiration of the cleanliness of Adelaide.

Special attention is paid to health. The house is in large grounds and close to the beach. Constant supervision in school hours and in the playground.

THE city thoroughfares are well lighted, both by gas and by electricity.

Both luminants are in the hands of private enterprise. The supply is of good quality and the distribution well managed. The luxury of a cheap supply cannot yet be indulged in by the householder, and one is inclined to hope a cheapening of it will not be overshadowed by enlarged dividends.

The population of Adelaide numbers about 150,000 souls, and compared with other cities of the Commonwealth, they bear the palm for being a well dressed orderly people. The "officer," as the policeman is called, is a stately and well-groomed man, and trained to prevent the commission of crime, rather than to capture the criminal. The system of patrol both by night and day is well directed and effective.

Church buildings abound both in City and suburbs to such an extent that Adelaide is frequently called the "City of Churches". A good idea both of their number, variety, and architectural design, will be gained from our illustrated pages.

Both literary and technical education hold a very prominent position in South Australia. The primary Public Schools display a high standard of efficiency, and attendance at them is both free and compulsory. The system of education pursued is intended to dovetail into the higher and broader one of the Universities. The school buildings are of good architectural appearance, and are roomy and well ventilated. There are two high class private schools, one under the auspices of the Church of England and the other under the Methodist Church, but as educational institutions they both work on non-sectarian lines.

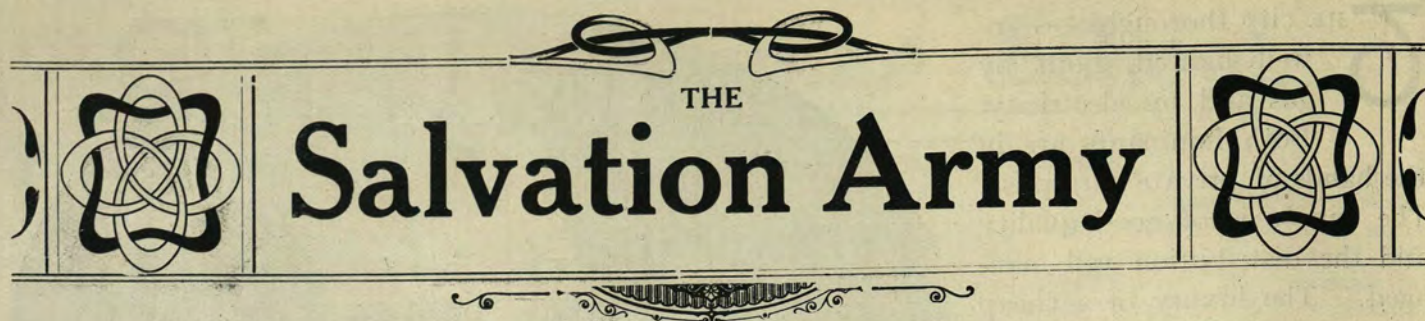

THE immediate superintendence of St. Peter's College is exercised by the Resident Head Master, who is a priest in holy orders and a gentleman of high culture and erudition. He is assisted by a large staff of under-masters and teachers, numbering about a score, all selected gentlemen possessing special qualifications for the particular subjects taught by them. The scholarships and exhibitions attached to the school have an annual value of £900, in which are embraced nine scholarships of an annual value of £50, and are tenable for three years.

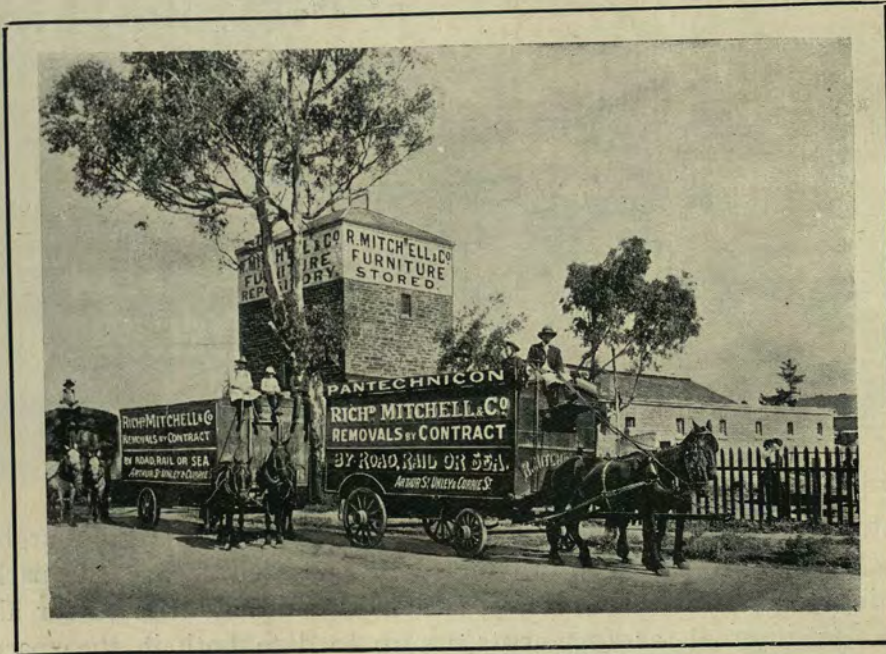

THE Methodist Ladies' College at Wayville, fronting the park lands of the city, is an excellent educational institution. It was founded in 1902 by the Methodist Church, and was located at Malvern. For the past four years it has occupied the premises known as Way College, and has largely increased the dimensions and conveniences of the building. It ranks now among the leading girls' schools in the Australian Commonwealth.

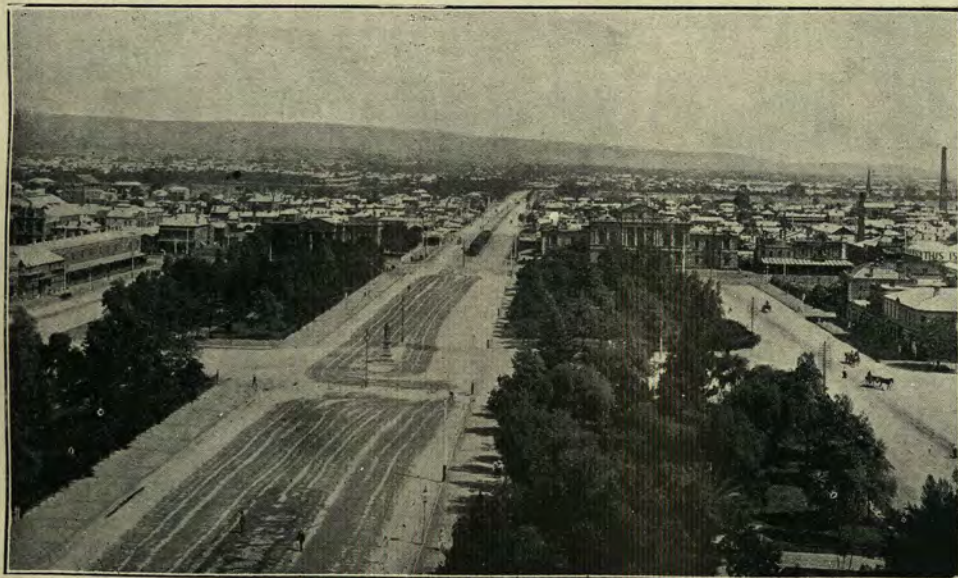


View taken from the Tower of Fire Brigade, looking west.

In a neat little prospectus issued by the promoters, we read—“It is managed by a committee of ladies and gentlemen appointed by the Methodist Conference. The college is an institution of high ideals, and provides the best education, based upon sound principles, at moderate cost.” And the general public has given evidence of confidence in the management and unsectarian character and excellence of the teaching by entrusting the college with the upbringing of their daughters. The curriculum of education set forth in the prospectus is extensive, well planned, and comprehensive, and the highest results can be obtained.

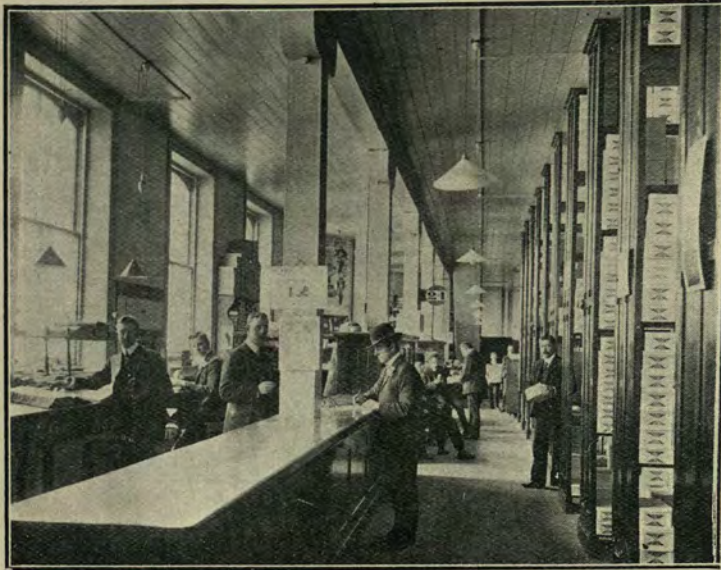
The University of Adelaide stands out pre-eminently amongst the highest grade educational institutions of Australasia. It was established in 1874, and empowered by Royal Letters Patent in 1881 to grant degrees which rank in common with the like degrees granted in any part of the British Empire. In the establishment and perpetual endowment of the Adelaide University, great public spirit and munificence have been manifested, and, as a stimulus to a like spirit, we shall place categorically the names of benefactors, together with the nature of their gifts.

It is generally known that the origin of the Adelaide University arose from the munificent gifts of £20,000 each by the late Sir Walter Watson Hughes and Sir Thomas Elder, G.C.M.G. The Parliament of the day provided for an annual grant from the public revenue, equal to 5 per cent. upon the capitalised funds, with a limit of £10,000; also under the same statute made a grant of 50,000 acres of land as an endowment, 5 acres upon which to build. The building was erected in 1879-1882, and the laying of the foundationstone was performed by His Excellency Sir W. F. D. Jervois, K.C.M.G.

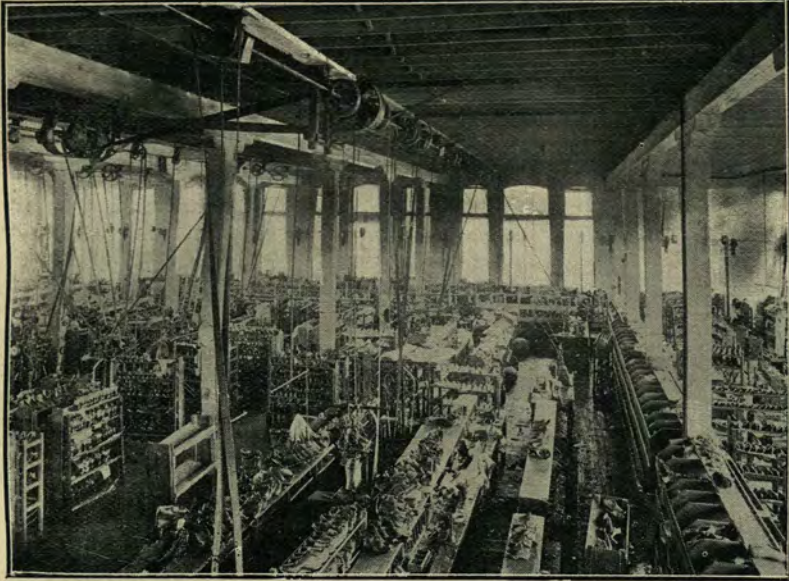

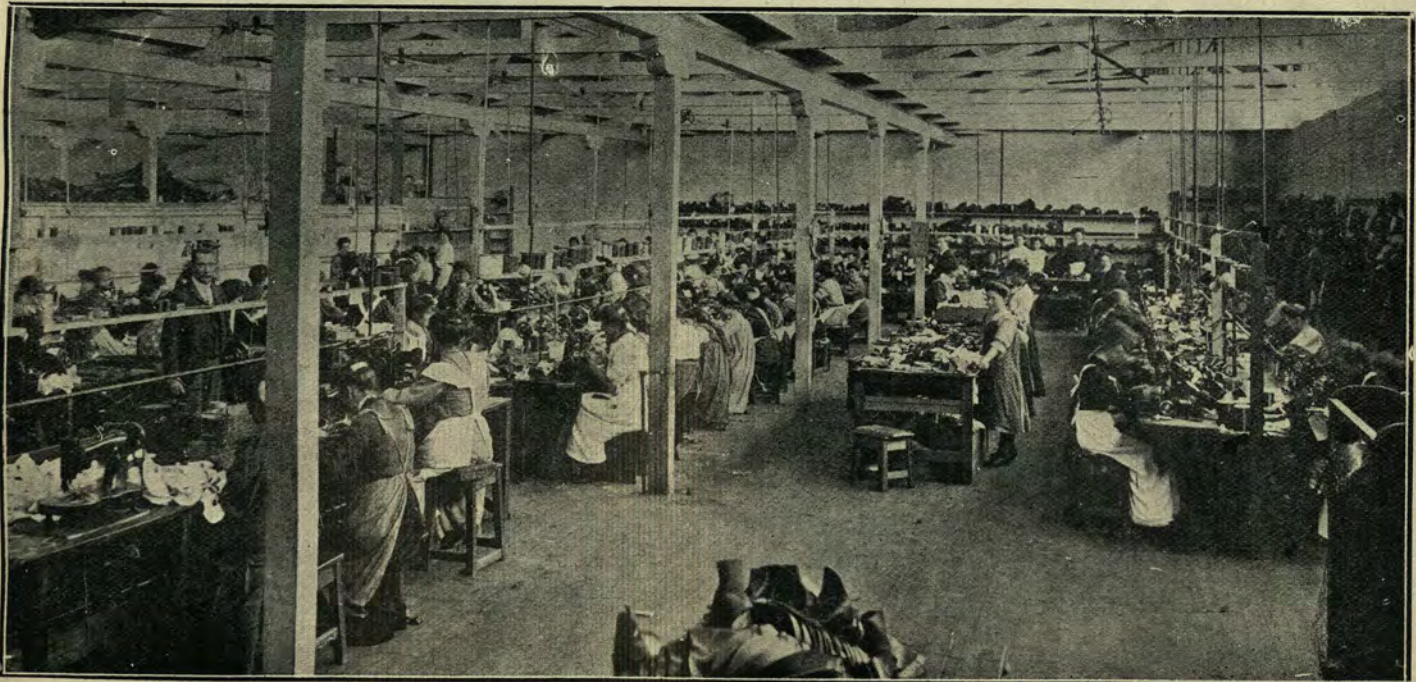

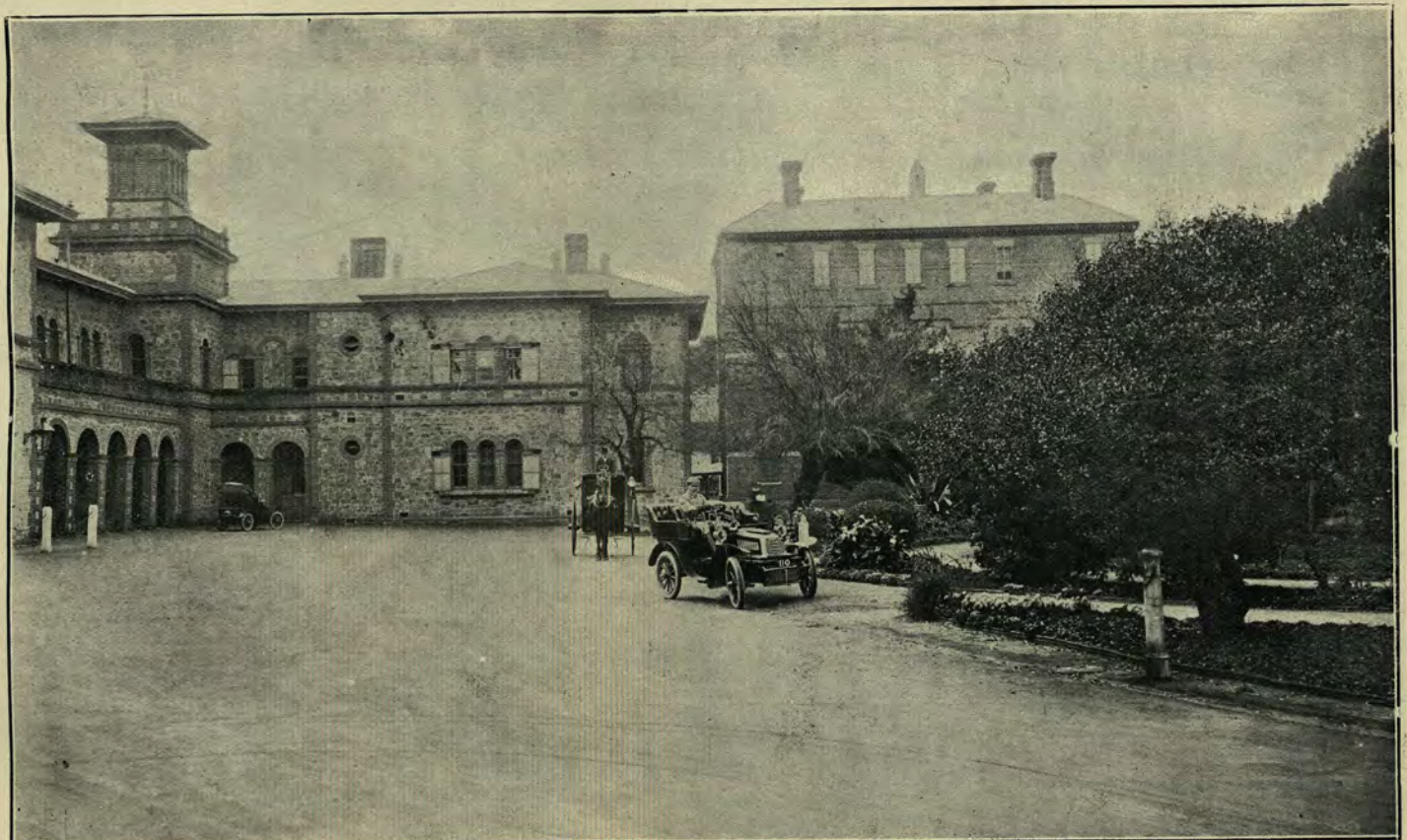

The Glass Bottle Industry.

PROBABLY the most interesting and instructive visit that can be paid to a manufactory in Adelaide is one to the glassworks of Mr. G. Hinrichsen, at Hindmarsh. Mr Hinrichsen was taught his trade in the best glass-blowing works in Germany, and came to this state and managed the glassworks of Messrs. Harrold Brothers, now defunct.

As with most big concerns, Mr. Hinrichsen's factory had a very small beginning, and the works when first started consisted of nothing more than a furnace and chimney stack covered over by a few sheets of corrugated iron, built almost entirely by Mr. Hinrichsen himself; but as time went on orders kept flowing in, Mr. Hinrichsen found it necessary to send to Melbourne for skilled workmen to assist him. From thence his wares were in great demand, and after a few years Mr. Hinrichsen was compelled to think of adding new furnaces to his premises, some idea of which can be obtained from our illustrations.

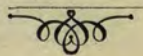


The Adelaide Glass Works.

The bottles manufactured at this factory are all made from the raw materials—sand (ordinary beach sands), lime, and soda, mixed with small quantities of other ingredients. Broken glass is sometimes added to bind the raw material more firmly. The lines chiefly manufactured are bottles for claret, champagne hocks, port wine, brandy flacons, preserve jars, electric cells, tubing, and almost every article in glass. Mr. Hinrichsen has not yet taken up the manufacture of glass table articles, as he explains that those goods are manufactured so cheaply in other countries that he is unable to compete with the imported article. Nevertheless the factory has a firm standing in the industries of the State and now covers an area of 3½ acres.



THE expenditure entailed in the construction of the Adelaide University was £38,000. In 1883 Sir Thomas Elder donated a second gift of £10,000 for the foundation of a School of Medicine. In 1884 the Hon. J. H. Angas, M.L.C., endowed a Chair of Chemistry, giving £6,000. A Chair of Music was established in 1884, and for the first five years £2,650 was publicly subscribed, out of which sum £1,500 was contributed by Sir Thomas Elder. In 1878 the Hon. J. H. Angas gave £4,000 to provide Scholarships in

Science subjects. Mr. Robert Barr Smith presented £1,000 in 1892, £1,000 in 1897, and £1,000 in 1899 towards the Library. The same gentleman also donated £2,000 in 1900, and £500 in 1902 for the purchase of books. Sir Thomas Elder made a bequest of £65,000 to the University, making his total donations £100,000. £20,000 of this magnificent bequest was apportioned by the terms of the will to a School of Medicine, and £20,000 to a School of Mines, while the balance was available for general purposes. The Elder Conservatorium of Music was established in 1898 and has since become a very prominent factor in the musical education of the State. The University is governed by a Council which consists of twenty members elected by the Senate, and that body is composed of all graduates of the M.A. or Doctor degree, and all other graduates of three years status, together with admissions from elsewhere *ad eundem gradum*.

The scope of University teaching is very extensive and the healthy patronage accorded it compels a steady growth. The latest and one of the most utilitarian University adjuncts has been the introduction of a Board of Commercial Studies. To be qualified for an advanced commercial certificate it is necessary to pass examinations in Business Practice, Commercial Law, Accountancy, Commercial History, Banking and Exchange, and Geography. Extension Lectures by the staff during winter evenings is now a very popular form of education.

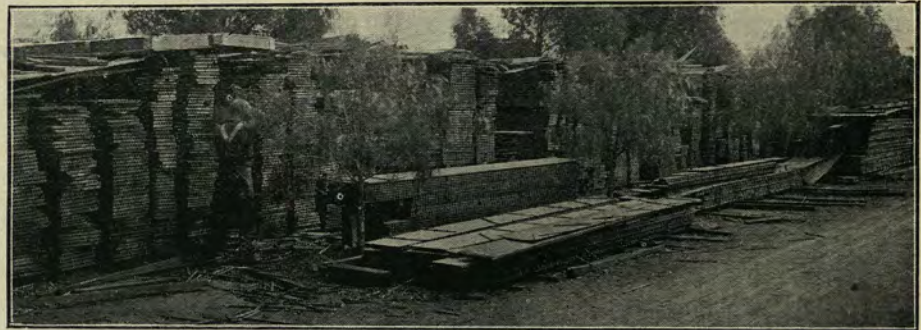

It would be impossible for everyone to visit this mammoth factory, but the photographs reproduced here will help to convey some idea of its magnitude and operations.

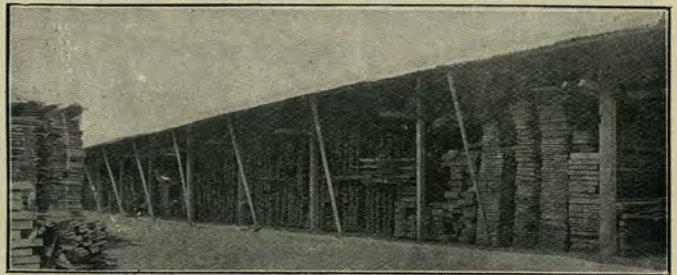

It then finds its way to the cabinetmakers' and joiners' shops, where every description of furniture is turned out in strong, firm, well balanced joinery, and handed over to varnishers, French polishers, upholsterers, and finishing trades generally, until the article is complete for delivery.

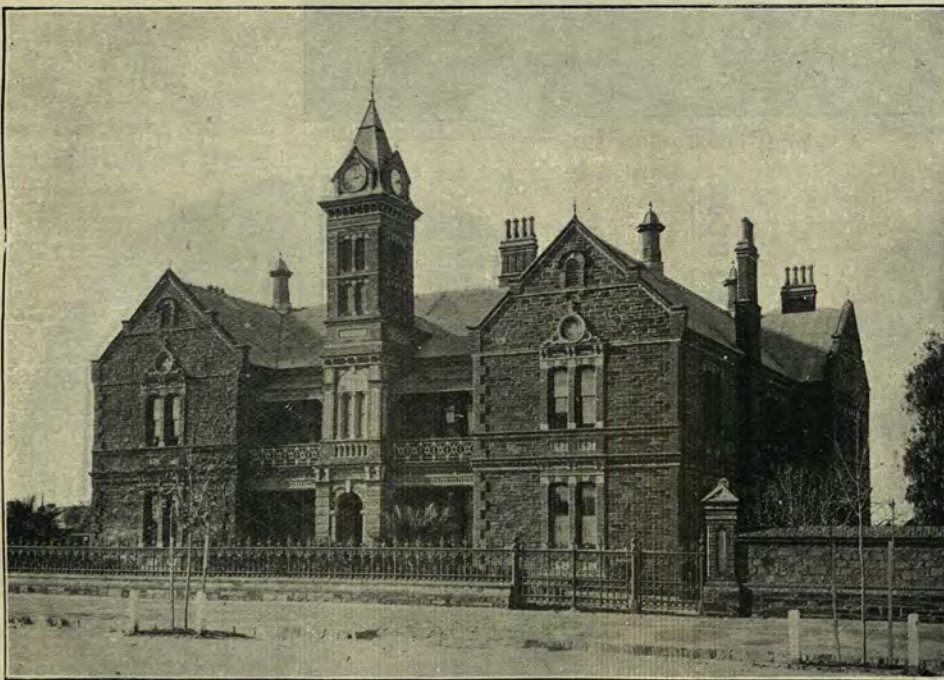
NORTH TERRACE. In a foregoing paragraph a casual mention has been made of North Terrace as one of the boundary thoroughfares of the city, but the significance imparted to it by the portentousness, number, and variety of its public buildings command an enlarged notice. Excepting where divided by public streets or roads, running at right angles, the whole length of frontage to North Terrace is occupied by public buildings which bear evidence to the culture, munificence, beneficence, philanthropy, and

commercial activity of both past and present generations of Adelaide's citizens. Commencing at the western boundary we meet the Public Saleyards for fat stock, being contiguous both to railway and road, and yet well separated from the active human life of the city. Following the Saleyards and in juxtaposition we come to the Railway Goods Department, which is always a busy centre. Hence come all the productions North, South, East, and West of the Metropolis, and thence go all the merchandise all over the State as far into the Territory as Oodnadatta. The Passenger Railway Station comes next, and much as one is tempted to give a careful description of this up-to-date building, space forbids. It has no equal in Australasia for suitability of design, convenience of appointment, public accessibility, public waiting space. Neither Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Perth, or Hobart, has such an open area in front of the ticket offices, where friends may remain together

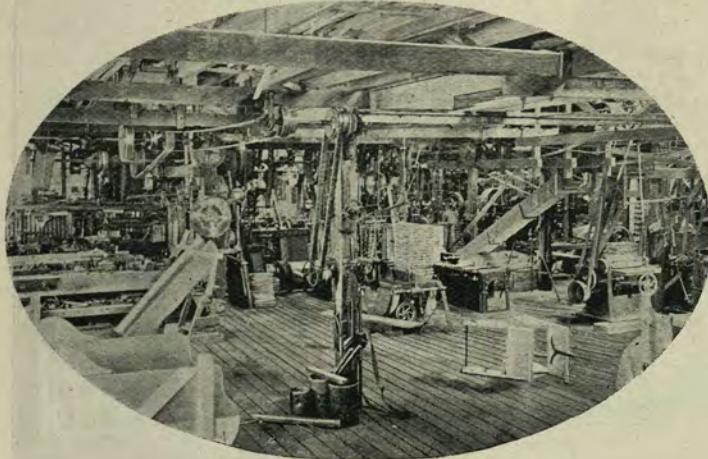
almost till the starting whistle, without interruption, and without payment. The lavatories, refreshment rooms, luggage offices, cab stands, and other adjuncts of public convenience and comfort, are in the most accessible positions, and strangers need scarcely ask a single question, as everything stands out before him like an open book. The Houses of Parliament come next in order and are good stone buildings without æsthetical pretensions, but the internal arrangements are said to be conducive to good parley.

CROSSING King William Street we next find the State Governor's residence and grounds. The whole is enclosed by a high stone wall which renders a view of it from the Terrace quite impossible. It is a comfortably constructed building, but lacks the embellishments which characterise modern edifices. The garden surrounding the building is well laid out, well kept, and stocked with all the choicest variety of flowering and ornamental trees, shrubs, and plants. The Free Public Libraries follow next in order, the first being the



Glenelg Line, Victoria Square Station,

lending branch, to which is attached the public newspaper room. These bear evidence of much public appreciation, if one can take the number of attendances daily as a fair criterion. The non-lending branch stands a chain to the eastward of the sister branch, and is a pleasantly-constructed three-story building. It is brim full of the latest publications in every department of literature. It is well looked after, and well managed, and its contents render it a most useful and pleasurable institution. The Museum comes next, and stands well back from the roadway, and has an imposing appearance. The contents are varied, extensive, and well displayed, and its educational value is highly appreciated by the citizens. In juxtaposition to the Museum stands the Art Gallery, a well-constructed stone building with effective internal design. Its contents, though small compared with those of Sydney and Melbourne, have the credit of possessing a high order of merit and artistic talent. Local art has an emphatic presence among the numerous exhibits. At the rear of the Art Gallery, Museum, and free public

Library, stand the Ordinance Stores, and Commonwealth Military Departments stationed in South Australia. This is an extensive block of buildings. Still continuing an easterly direction we next meet with the University buildings with its various attaches. The Elder Conservatorium of Music is a handsome stone structure standing well back from the avenue, and relieved in front by a well kept grassy lawn. In the centre of the lawn stands a well-poised bronze statue of the late Sir Thomas Elder, on a handsome granite pedestal graced on the four sides by inset shields indicative of the peculiar spheres of human culture he wished his munificence to stimulate and perpetuate.

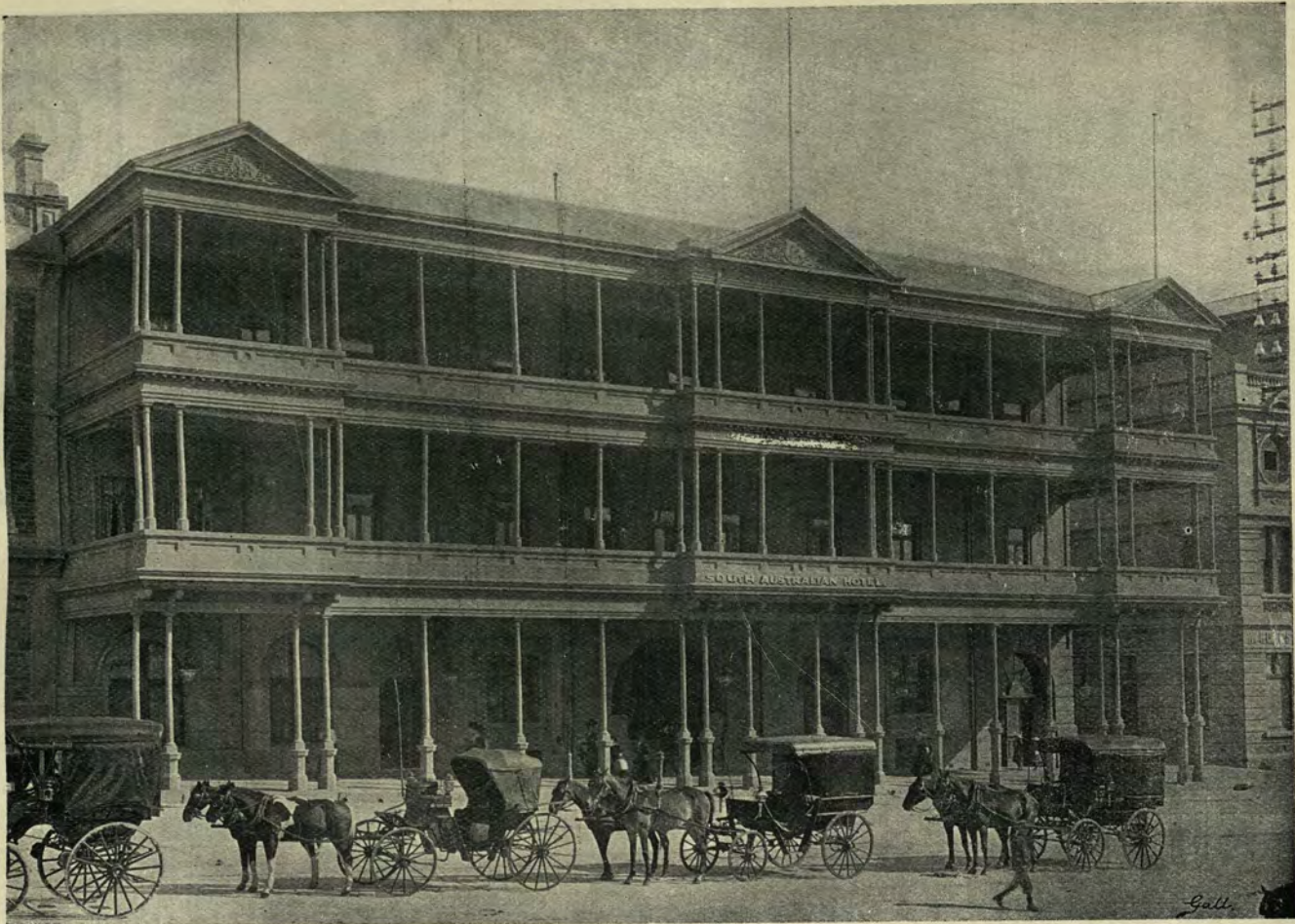

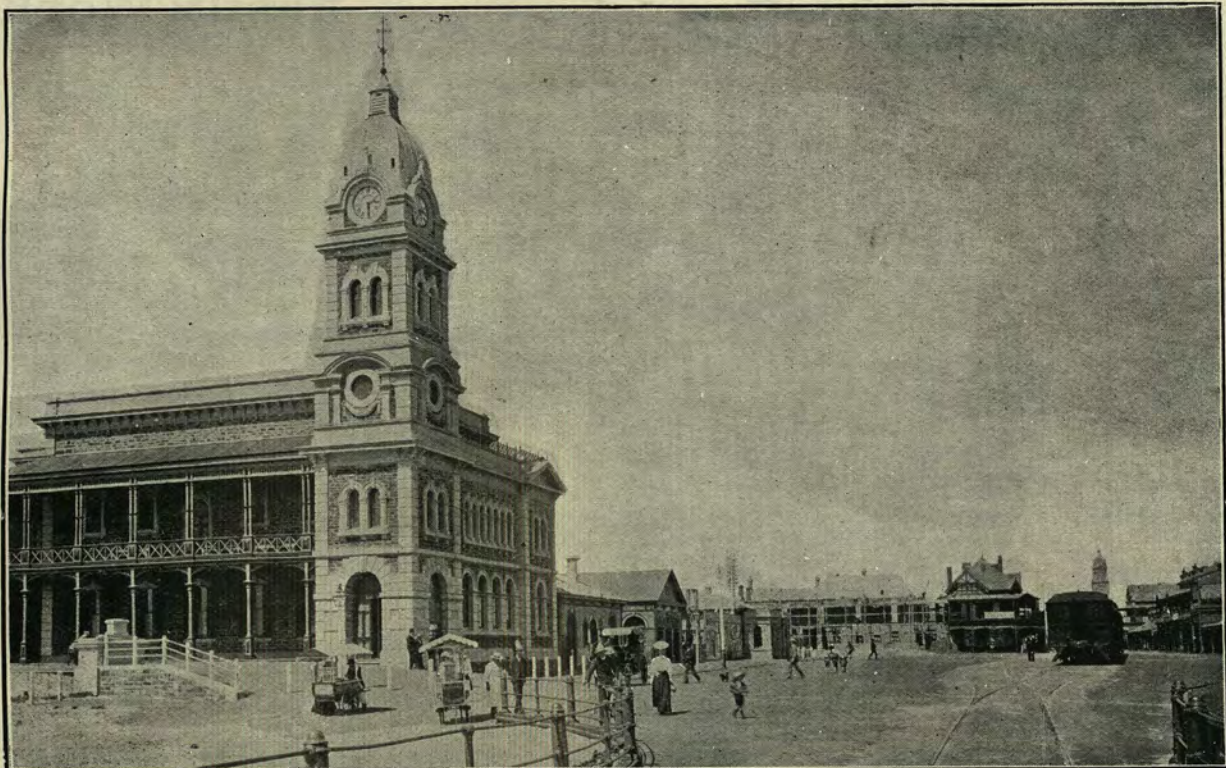

ANOTHER most fitting statue is erected immediately in front of the University bearing the life-like figure, in bronze, of the late Sir W. Watson Hughes, the first to donate a large sum of money for the founding of this noble and ennobling pile. From the University we pass to the Jubilee Exhibition Buildings which embrace the rooms of the Chamber of Manufactures. This structure is extensive, handsome, and imposing, and was built to commemorate the Jubilee of our late excellent Queen. It serves as the great



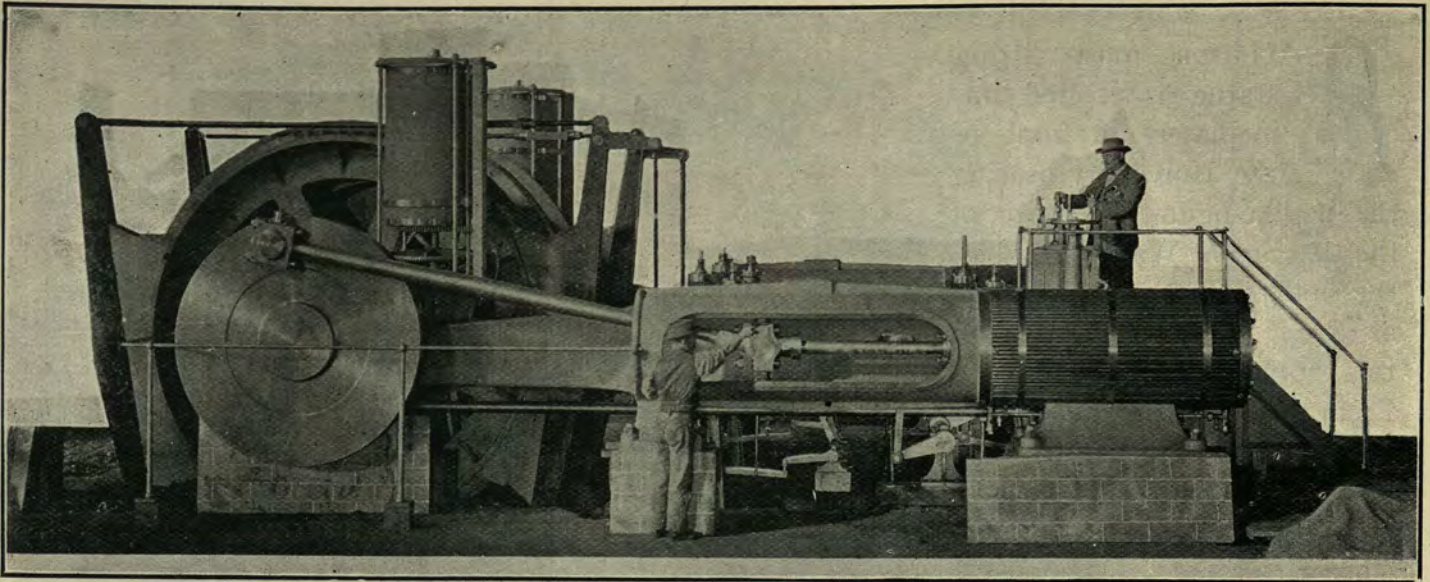

Pavilion at the Annual Agricultural and Industrial Exhibition, and is available as a concert and public entertainment hall during most part of the year. At the rear, and extending backward nearly to the Torrens River and laterally to Frome Road, are the grounds, annexes, pavilion, and show rings, upon and in which the annual displays of live stock, agricultural implements and machinery are located at Show time. Jubilee Oval as the parade enclosure is called, is one of the centres in which sports are extensively carried on throughout the year, and being near the centre of the city, are well patronised. Following the North Terrace eastward we next see a handsome, modern red-brick structure, with freestone angles, abutments and cornices. This building is of striking architectural beauty and symmetry. In conformity to the wishes of the late benefactor it is called the School of Mines, but perhaps is more strictly a Technical College. The external splendor of the building has its counterpart in the internal splendor

of the number and variety of the subjects taught, and the moderate cost at which such a variety of utilitarian subjects may become the property of the general public. This princely structure is mainly due to the not less princely generosity of the Hon. G. Brookman, M.L.C. who donated no less a sum than £15,000 towards its erection. The addition of another £22,000 has endowed the Queen City of Adelaide with a treasure trove whose richness will continue to multiply as generation after generation passes away.

A VERY delightful Avenue called Frome Road strikes in a northerly direction immediately we pass the School of Mines and crosses the Torrens River by a handsome iron bridge, into lower North Adelaide; but before the bridge is reached the visitor is struck by the beauty of a handsome pair of iron gates fronting well-kept paths, through which the popular Zoo opens out before us. Back again in North Terrace we are confronted by the Adelaide Hospital; a pile of carefully-constructed brick buildings, standing well back behind a spacious lawn and clusters of shady trees. If the number and variety of the buildings indicate the care of the sick and suffering and intelligent battling with the diseases of poor humanity, then the endless piles of attached, semi-detached, and detached theatres and structures, bear evidence of an institution equipped in the highest degree to pursue the mission of philanthropy in the most excellent manner. The gate of the Botanical Gardens stands at the eastern end of North Terrace. No pleasanter, more refreshing, nor restful spot can be found about the Queen City than its charming botanical gardens. It has all the elements of rest, comfort, beauty, and attractiveness. Its well-kept

asphalt footpaths are laid out with a fascination of design quite unique. Paths encircle flower beds in oval, conical, circular, diamond, serpentine, and every conceivable fantasia of form and beauty. Cosy retreats, comfortable seats, refreshing fountains, multi-colored flower beds, and green grassy lawns, rival each other as to which offers the choicest morsels in whiling away the time. To the student of botany, floriculture, aboriculture, fauna, and flora, whether indigenous or exogenous, the finished and completely stocked, kept, and beautified Gardens of Adelaide offer a place fairly to revel in and one which tells every visitor of the zealous indefatigability of the Curator and his vigilant staff.

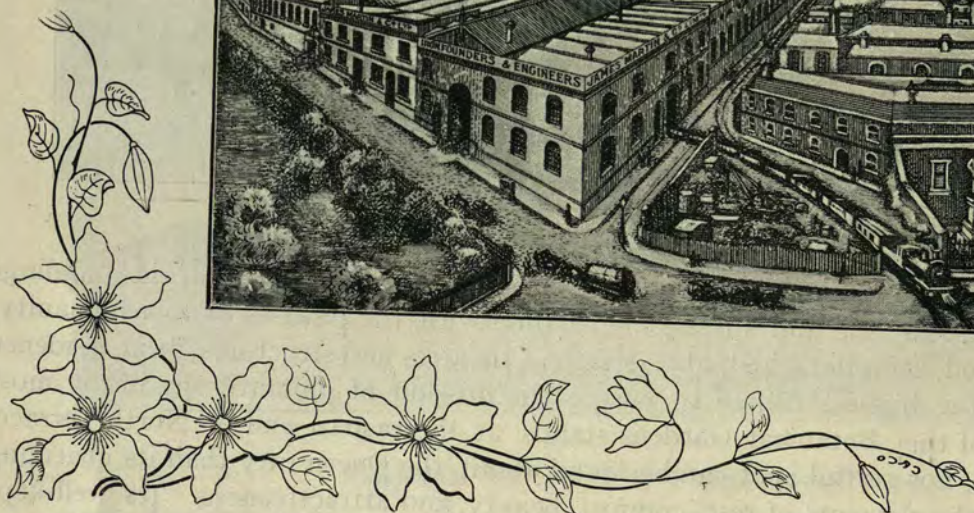
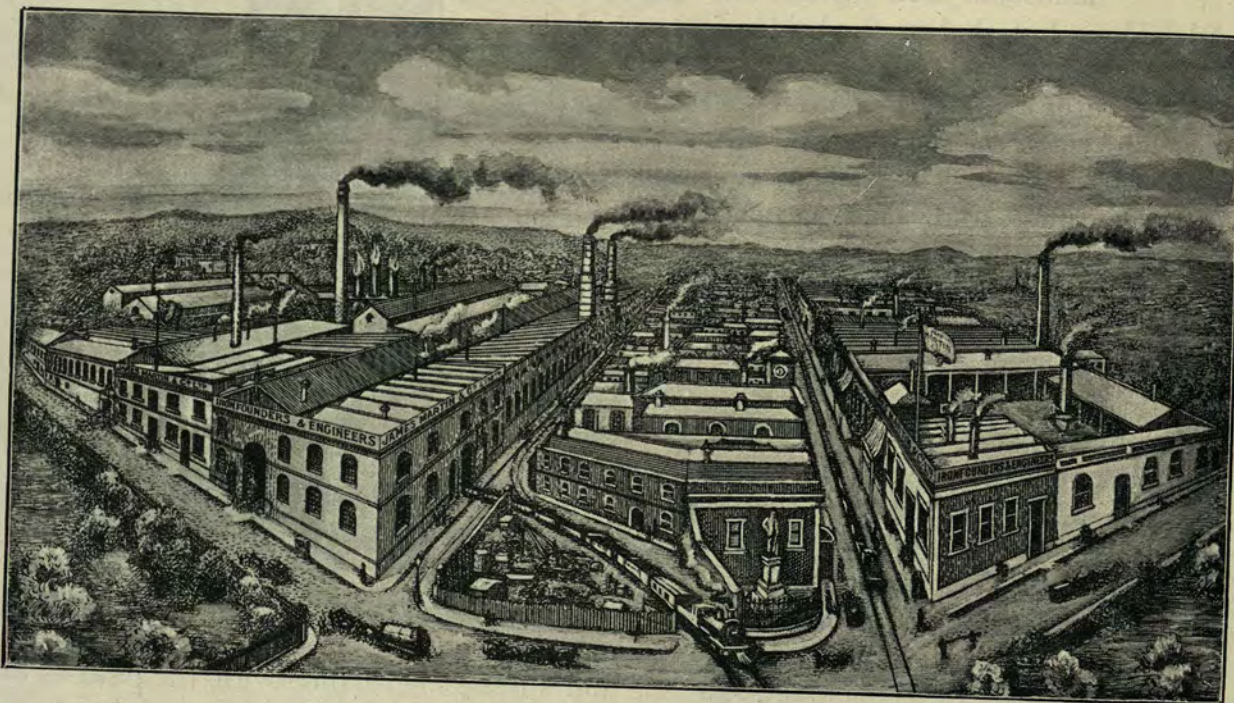

ADELAIDE : QUEEN CITY OF THE SOUTH.

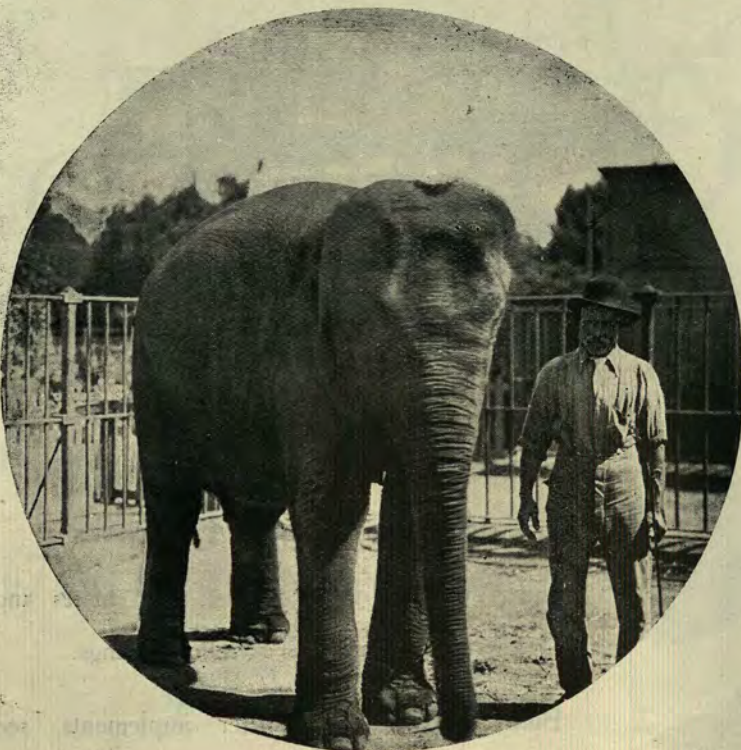
THE suburban cities and towns of Adelaide, although enjoying like civil advantages to the City in water supply, sewerage, and lighting, are altogether out of axis with her in plan and arrangement. The leading suburb is North Adelaide, which to a greater extent than any other, bears evidence of the same design as is manifest in the City. Standing on high ground north of the Torrens River, this suburb has attracted many leading and wealthy citizens. The locality is a commanding one, the air pure and invigorating, the streets and terraces are well-kept, and altogether a mein of superiority rests on the suburb. In the centre is a small park named after the Duke of Wellington, and known as Wellington Square, and park lands surround on every side. For density of population the suburbs of Norwood and Unley rank first, then come East Adelaide, Hindmarsh, Goodwood, Walkerville, etc., and passing outward into the less populated parts, we come across many handsome private dwellings, surrounded by park lands, studded with ornamental trees, and beautified with well-kept flower and fruit gardens.

The Queen City in relation to its industrial surroundings is unique in the Australian Commonwealth. Manufactories are not numerous, although they hold a distinctly recognised position, and our illustrations give the reader a glimpse of their magnitude and activity. The striking conditions

peculiar to the environs of Adelaide relate more to industries which lay at the foundation of domestic comfort, such as market gardening dairying, fruit culture, and hay growing. All these industries thrive within a distance of half-an-hour of the City, in every direction, and fresh fruit, eggs, vegetables, and green fodder and hay are abundant and cheap. In, and around other Australian cities many miles have to be traversed before such conditions are met, and even then no uniformity of productiveness is observable. To a large extent however, this is rendered possible by the extensive reticulation of an abundant water supply, gravitating in all directions, its fertilising properties being largely availed of by the residents.

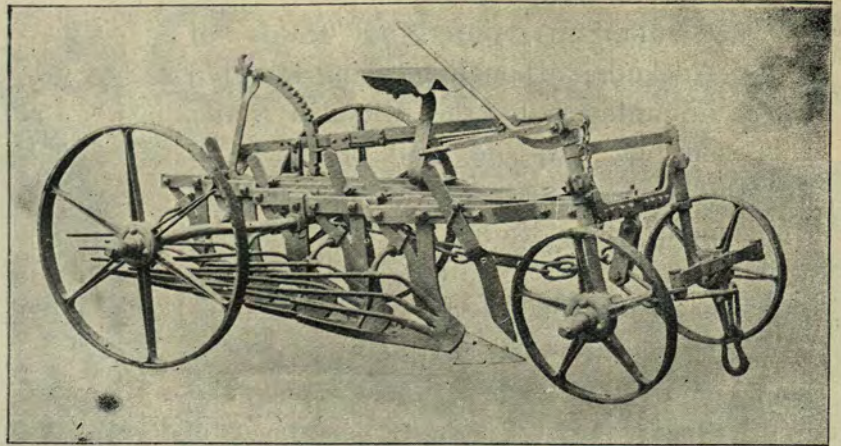

ASCENDING the hill country east from the City, the most interesting features unfold themselves. INTELLIGENT men familiar with Australian life generally have marked a peculiarity about the South Australian population, and in order to get at the foundation of it, it is necessary to become acquainted with the history of colonization, as contrasted with that of older states. South Australians are said to be a peculiar people, and primary conditions would produce that result as a natural sequence. Hence some observations about the early colonists and methods of colonization will not be out of place. In the old country public attention was stimulated on the topic of colonization by the result of Flinders's explorations and Sturt's graphic accounts of his Australian adventures, so much so that a Committee was formed in 1831 and opened up negotiations with the Home Government for a charter to establish a new colony. Their intention was to start a settlement on sounder principles of political economy and with a higher regard to the rights of colonists. This Committee of high ideals died without fruit, but several years later, in 1834, another Committee was formed

which became of a permanent character and its name and operations still live in our midst. "The South Australian Association" is the parental stock of this great State. Colonel Torrens (a name immortalised) moved the fundamental resolution at Exeter Hall, London, in June 1884. In that resolution the three essentials to success in colonisation were bracketed, in land, capital and labor, and in moving it, the Colonel said that the absence of a wise discrimination in combining these

three in due proportion was the cause of most failures in attempting the establishment of new colonies. The custom then prevalent of making large free land grants to favored pioneer colonists was to be discontinued. No land was to be acquired without a fair price being paid for it, and it was to remain the public estate, and to be disposed of only for purposes of creating and sustaining a fund for upholding the financial solvency of the state. Mr. Edward Gibbon Wakefield propounded the theory that "the price of land should be fixed high enough to create an Emigration Fund by its sale, and this fund was to be utilised in the exportation of suitable agricultural laborers." In practice this excellent theory failed to apply and soon fell into disfavor. Phoenix-like however, success found a champion in the person of the late George Fife Angas, a member of the South Australian Company, who by persistent herculean effort won the distinction of being named the "Father of South Australia."

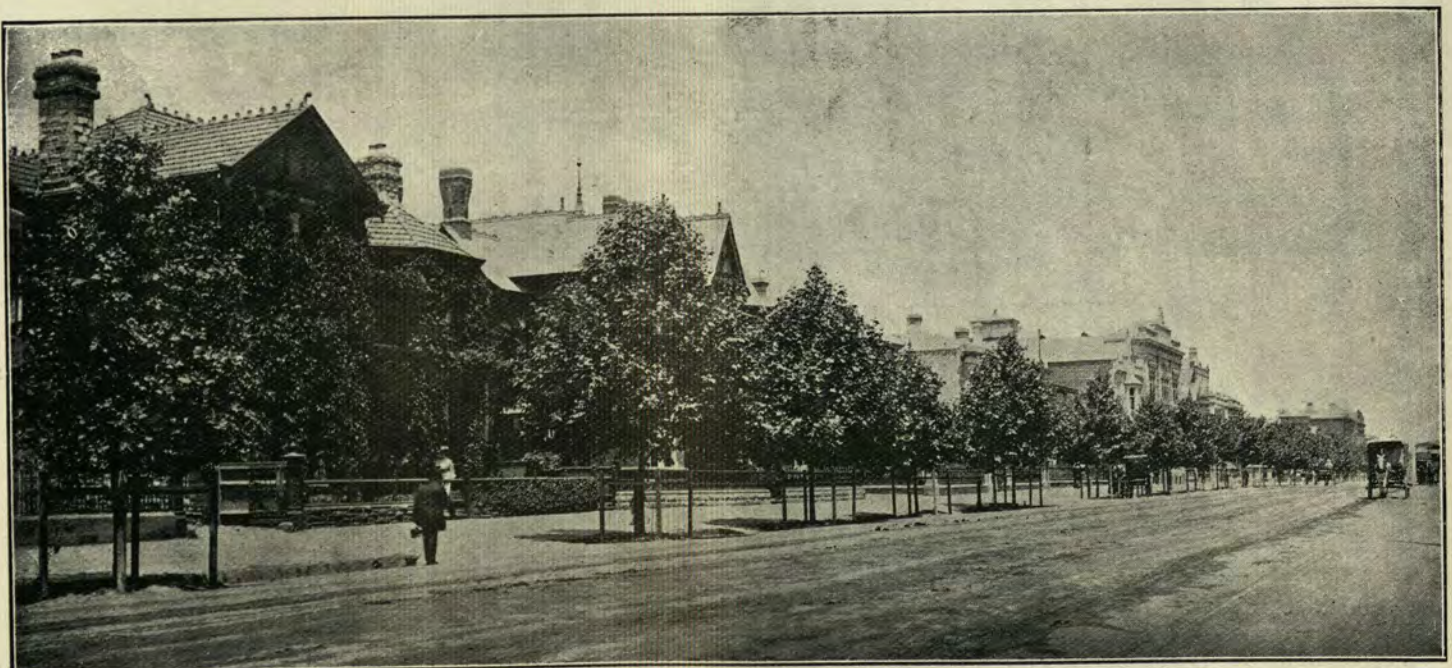
- (1) the exclusion of convicts,

having purchased sufficient land at 12/, were enabled in 1834 to comply with the Act creating South Australia into a British province, and make provision for its future expansion and government. Unlike Botany Bay, Port Phillip, Moreton Bay, Swan river, and Port Albert, all more or less convict settlements, it was established "that no person, or persons, convicted in any court of justice in Great Britain, or elsewhere, shall at any time or under any circumstances be transported to any place within the limits of South Australia." Space forbids enlarging upon this most interesting subject, but perseverance, undaunted by temporary failures, finally triumphed, and brought this great State into the foremost rank among British possessions, as it stands to-day.

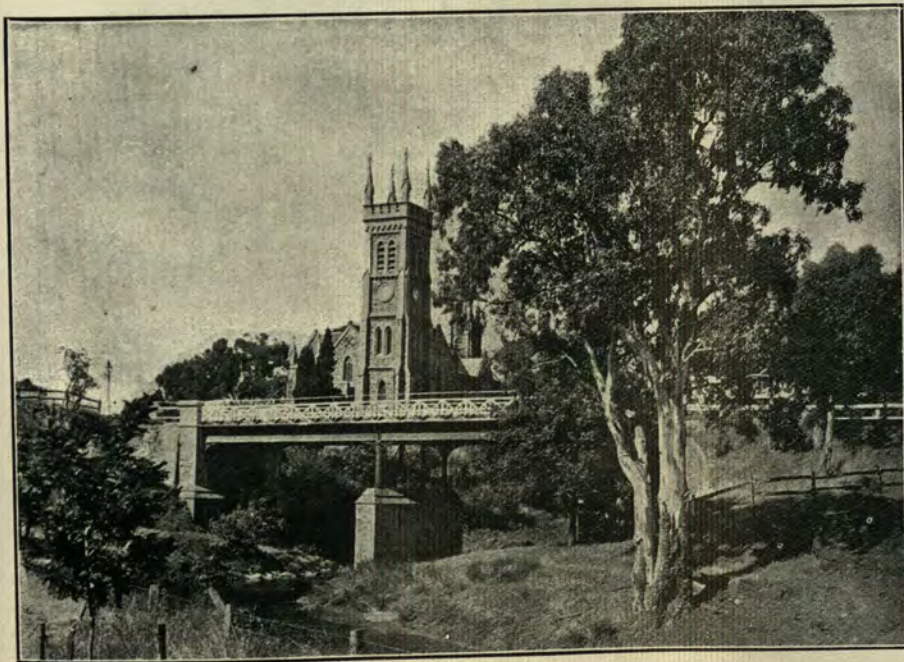
PROCLAIMING THE PROVINCE.

IN writing on this subject we cannot do better than quote from the writings of Mr. David D. Gordon, who in his work on "The Central State" says:—

"The 'Buffalo,' with His Excellency Captain Hindmarsh on board, dropped anchor in Holdfast Bay (Glenelg), on December 28, 1836. The Governor landed the same day, and under the generous shade of gum trees close to the beach the Union Jack was hoisted, the proclamation read, salutes fired, and South Australia officially started on its course. The commission was read to about 200 settlers then present, the health of 'His Majesty,' 'The Governor,' 'Officers,' and 'Success to South Australia,' were drunk amid cheers of great enthusiasm. The national anthem was sung with vigor, and the remainder of the day spent in jollity and amusement." The area of the mainland comprising the province was at first 190,000,000 acres. In 1861 80,000 square miles were added, being a strip of country between this province and West Australia, and in 1863 the country known as the Northern Territory was also added, making a total area of 903,690 square miles, or 578,361,600 acres, and extending from the Southern to the Indian Ocean. The population of this great State is about 375,000 souls, and the majority of them are settled in and around the metropolitan area. The major part of this vast Territory is unpopulated and unimproved, and nothing less than three million inhabitants could hope to adequately grapple with its exploitation and development. Its potentialities are great, and the handful of inhabitants thrifty and industrious, but the acreage is so boundless that very little visible impression is possible under present population conditions.

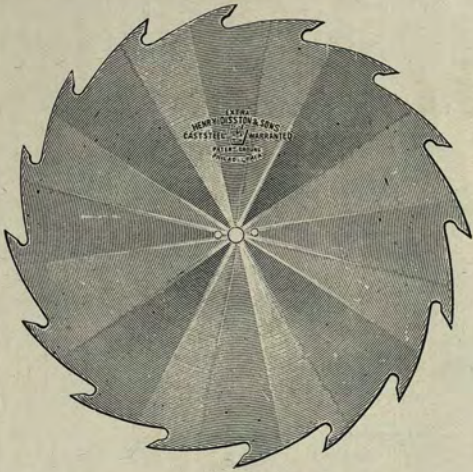

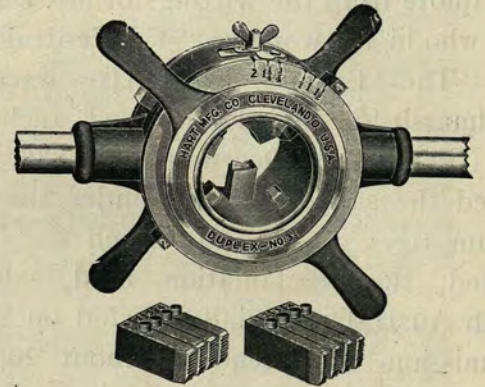

In physical contour South Australia may be regarded as level. Its mountains are few and their altitude not great; hence the absence of prominent rivers. In its final course the great Australian River Murray flows through about 500 miles of South Australia; but its various tributaries, as well as its main stream, rise on the high mountains of the great dividing chain of Australia, and the latter follows a sluggish course for over 3,000 miles till, meeting the Murray, their waters emerge into the ocean at Lake Alexandrina.



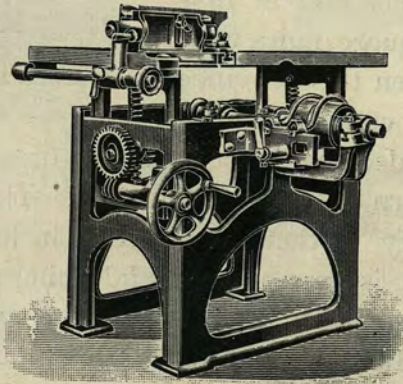

NOTWITHSTANDING the absence of rivers the State is well supplied with subterranean water. By boring, almost any locality will yield a bountiful supply, and the farmers excavate dams in all directions on their holdings, to capture the copious showers which fall during the summer months, so that, excepting in the more arid interior, a scarcity of water is unheard of. The most important industrial pursuits in the State are: the pastoral industry, both sheep and cattle; the agricultural industry, especially wheat-growing, vine-growing, and wine distilling; fruitgrowing, especially apples, pears, and plums. Although these may be regarded as leading pursuits, there are minor ones to no end, all of which serve to demonstrate a soil and a climate so varied in its conditions and quality, as to offer the strongest inducement for the investment of capital, and the application of labor and intelligence. There is a prompt spontaneity in the productiveness of South Australian soil not met with in the Eastern States, and climatic influences converge to stimulate and perfect it. Openings abound in every direction for the careful investment of capital, and the thoughtful application of labor, and no part of the British possessions offers greater temptation for spirited immigration. To give one a clear and concise conception of what South Australia is doing, what she produces, and what she exports, the Editor refers the reader to the statistical tabulated forms, specially compiled for this work, which will be found at the end of the book. For convenience of description and identification the State of South Australia is subdivided into Hundreds, the term being applied to 100 measured square miles;

of these there are 410. Embraced in these are 141 District Councils, and 32 Municipal Corporations. The total assessment of the 141 District Councils amounts to £1,600,000, while that of the 32 Municipal Corporations shows a value of £1,200,800. Since its proclamation as a province South Australia has undergone decisive progress in its political government. Under the Act originally creating the province, South Australia was governed by a Board of Colonization Commissioners, located in London, who exercised extensive control in all important matters. The Governor was autocrat of the situation up till 1851. He was assisted by a Council of his own appointment, and under his domination, and made his iron will keenly felt by the independent spirits of the settlers. When the time was ripe for the promised Constitution, the relief afforded in throwing off this iron yoke amounted almost to a political revolution. A constitution was promised when the population numbered 50,000 souls, when it was gained the number was over 66,000.

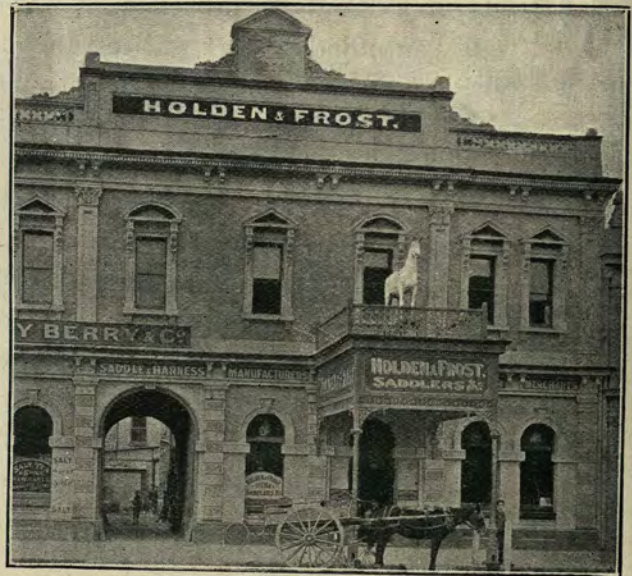

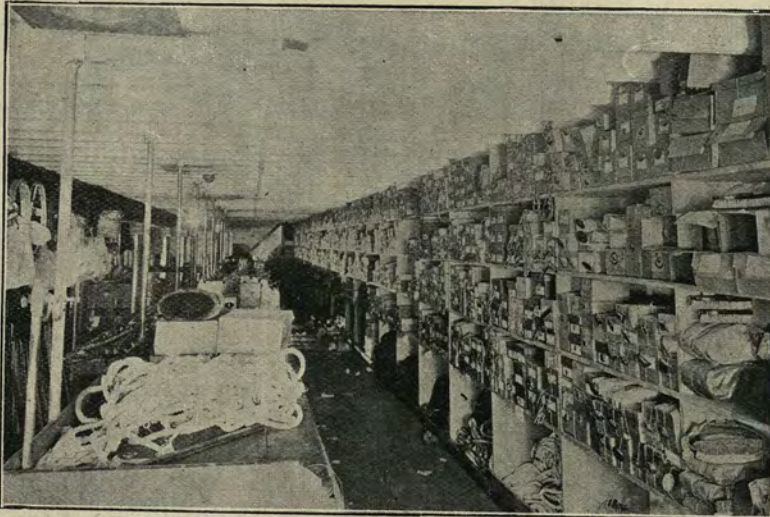

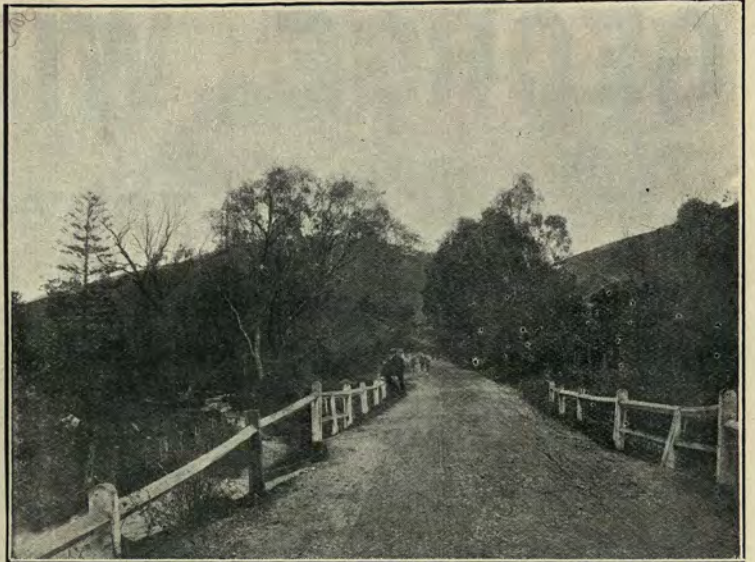

THE first constitution for South Australia authorised a Legislative Council of 24 members, 8 to be nominees of the Governor, and 16 to be elected by householders and property owners. In 1856 the dual parliament was established, both on an electoral basis; the Council to consist of 18 members and the Assembly of 36 members, the former elected on a property franchise and the latter on manhood suffrage. In 1873 the councillors were increased to 46, and to 54 in 1884, but in 1901 were reduced to 42. The franchise was granted to

women in 1894, while payment of members began in 1887. It is interesting to note that South Australia leads the Australian States in securing an elective upper house, payment of members, womanhood franchise, and the present ballot system, while the Real Property Act of South Australia has been copied, not only in the Commonwealth, but in many parts of the world.

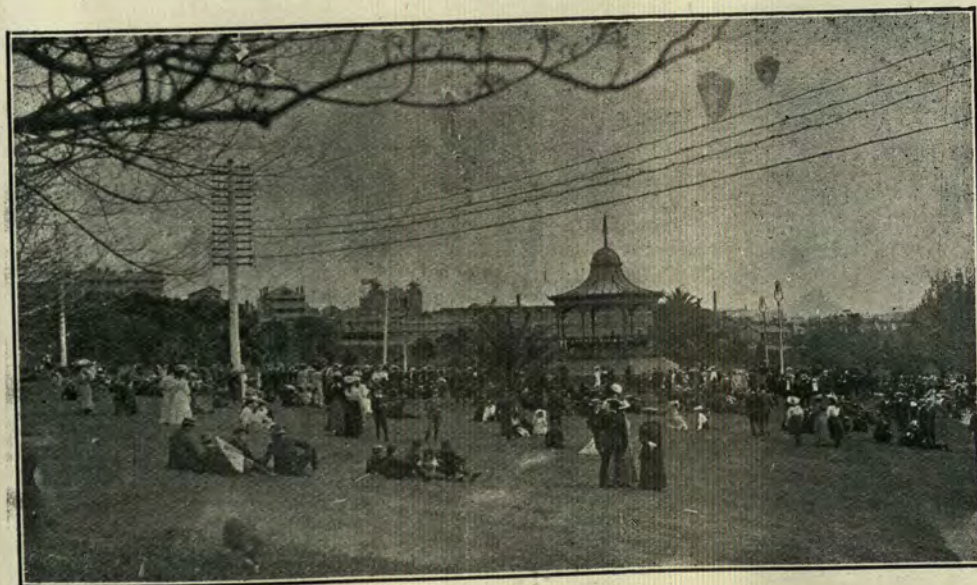
The well formed and well kept roads throughout the State are the effect of a splendid system of local self-government ; while other States have talked South Australia has acted.

The State is divided into central, southern, northern, and north-eastern, for Legislative Council purposes, and into 13 districts for the Assembly ; but the disadvantage of districts electing three or more representatives still prevails, and in that condition the State is content to lag behind in the march of progress. The land laws are now administered with an elastic hand, and sons of farmers are competing with each other in securing a slice of the large estates recently made available by the intervention of the government of the day in buying up and reselling them upon easy terms,

or by owners themselves submitting them to the hammer on extended terms of payment. The desire to secure land for agricultural and pastoral purposes is great, but there is a lack of the knowledge necessary to success among aspirants to country life. South Australia offers a boundless scope for the educated farmer and husbandman. Like other Australian cities, the scramble for higher wages induces men to flock thither, and thus the country suffers by the large proportion of unproductive labor.

THE most populous towns in South Australia are Port Pirie, Port Augusta, Mount Gambier, and Gawler. Port Pirie lies 168 miles to the N.W. of Adelaide, and is chiefly supported by the world-famed Broken Hill Silver Mines. Port Augusta lies 259 miles in the same direction, shipping, agricultural and pastoral pursuits being the mainstay of the place. Mount Gambier is one of the principal pleasure spots in the state with its wonderful crater lakes, many curious caves, and English scenery. The Blue Lake, the

most important of the group, is nearly a mile across from east to west. It is surrounded by rocky banks, varying from 200ft. to 300ft. in height, and the water can only be approached at two points by prepared paths. The lake varies in depth from 180ft. to 330ft. The many beauties of the surrounding scenery, the adjoining lakes and caves are well worth a visit. Mount Gambier is situated about 350 miles to the S.E. of Adelaide, and is chiefly supported by agricultural enterprise. Gawler, only 25 miles from the City, is a large manufacturing centre for agricultural implements, etc., containing two of the largest factories in the State, and is frequently called the "Sheffield" of South Australia. Agricultural pursuits also play an important part in the surroundings of Gawler.

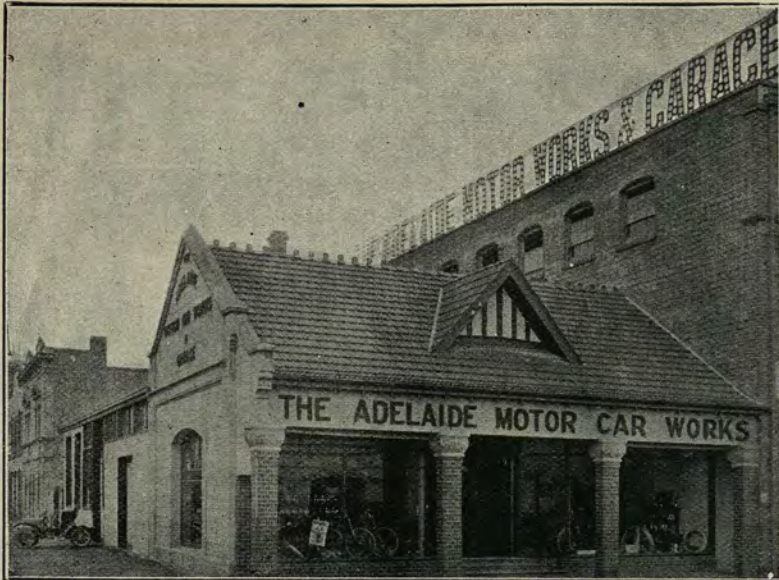
The State Bank of South Australia, established in 1896, situated in Pirie Street, is a useful democratic government institution. It raises money by the sales of mortgage bonds, and makes advances on Crown leasehold and freehold securities. Already it has sold bonds to the large amount of £986,260, has redeemed £404,930, and has the balance of £581,330 still current. Of total advances £1,011,110, a sum of £408,744 has been repaid, leaving a balance current of

£602,366. The bank is managed by a Trust of whom G. Inglis, Esq. is Chairman, the others being Messrs. G. Fuller, A. M. Simpson, H. D. Gell, and E. W. Krichauff. Mr. G. S. Wright is the Inspector-General, and Mr. F. McNamara the Accountant.

The general burden of taxation is considered light, but if there is a pinch, it is that of the two-penny stamp on the half-oz. letter, for the minimum as well as the maximum distances. In this behalf, the citizens of Adelaide are well excused from a quiet grumble.

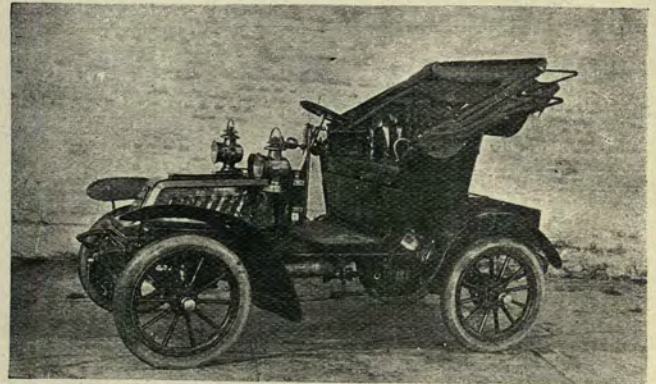

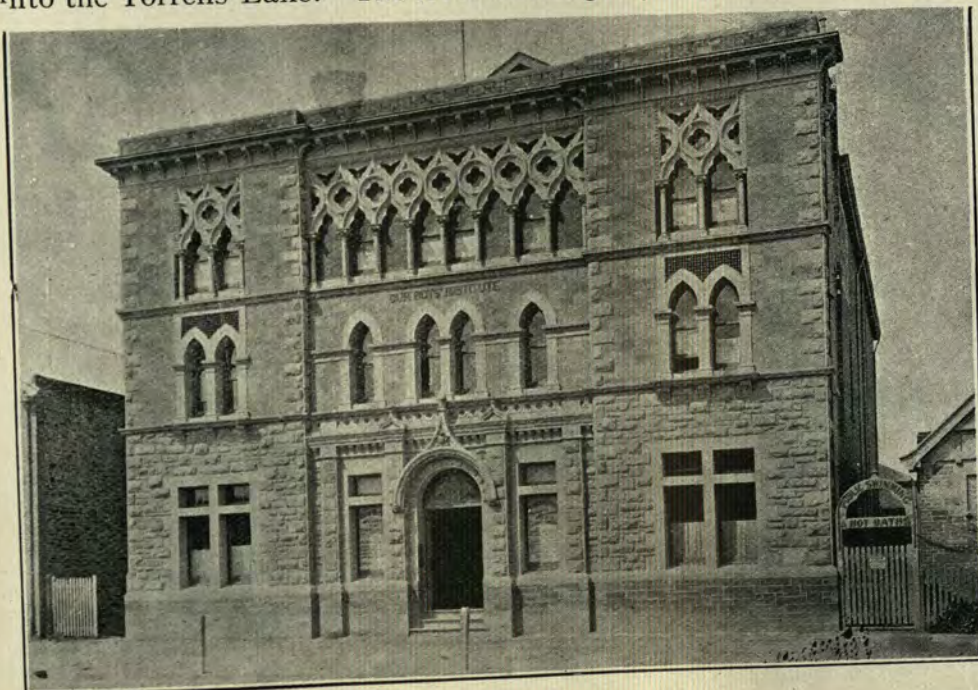
THE Torrens River has not yet received that amount of attention to which it is fairly entitled. The weir or dam constructed across it at the north-west angle of the city dams back a long stretch of water, and forms what could be, and really is, a very attractive lake—Torrens Lake. Aquatic exercises and sports are indulged in upon the lake in the summer months, and a little turbine steamer runs sixpenny trips Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, up and down its length, while "boats for hire" may be had in any number and at low



prices. The quantity, depth, and width of water is good, and on the banks are umbrageous trees, still there is an unkemptness which either tells of a lack of money wherewith to beautify or a lack of appreciation among our civic authorities to adequately grapple with the power and fascination of this lovely rendezvous. It is capable of being converted into the most charming and attractive spot in the environs of the Queen City. Though not a great river, the Torrens is an important factor in the well being and well doing of a considerable industrial population. Taking its rise far back in the hills and being fed by numerous small perennial streams, it irrigates the orchards and gardens of hundreds of settlers and waters their stock. In many places there are "reaches" which show width, depth, and volume of no mean dimensions, many miles before it reaches the steep ravines down which it rushes to the valley called The Gorge. At this juncture a strongly constructed weir throws back a mile of pure water, which is conveyed by flume and pipe to the reservoirs, whence the city is supplied. Some distance below the weir it gains volume again, and has a very pretty flow right into the Torrens Lake. The river is bridged in eight different places, to facilitate traffic in the various

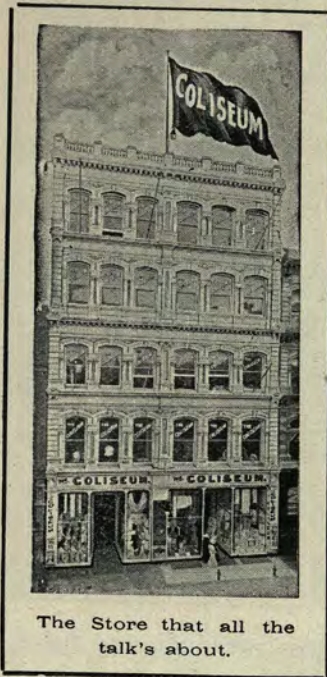
suburbs through which it flows; finally it loses itself in a large area of swampy ground, half-a-mile from Spencer's Gulf, called Reedbeds. It has the like ignoble ending to the Murray and other streams running into the Southern Ocean.

Important towns suburban to Adelaide are Port Adelaide, Unley, Norwood, and Glenelg. Each has a distinct life of its own, and is a municipal centre, with a town hall and other adjuncts of independent life, but the two are so distinctly separated in chief characteristics that further comparison is impossible

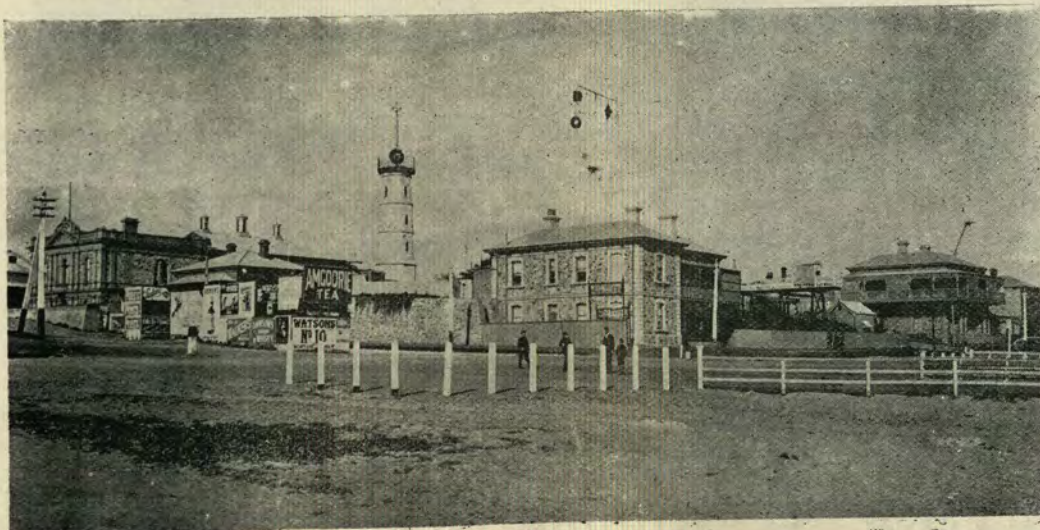
SPORTS AND PASTIMES
 The denizens of the Queen City are unmistakably a sport-loving people. Football attracts the greatest notice, owing to the excitement it arouses among all classes of spectators. Horseracing comes next, then cricket, tennis, rowing, golf, polo, hunting, cycling, and motoring, with all the minor games incidental to Australian life. The Adelaide Golf Club has recently con-

structed an 18-hole course at Seaton, about 6 miles from the city, and near the Grange. Visitors express much satisfaction at the Club's new course. The Glenelg Golf Club is a much older one and has had a popular course for some years, and holds a leading position.

Musical and Literary Competitions are a distinctive feature in the quasi-amusement occupations of South Australians. They afford a healthy mutual rivalry among the population, and are answerable for a good deal of literary achievement and musical dexterity. They are very popular throughout the State. Owing to the level nature of the country and the well kept roads, cycling—both for pleasure and as a means of locomotion—is very popular, and Adelaide can boast of more cycle depots than any city in Australia. Motoring has lately taken a tremendous leap forward. Three years ago a motor car in the street was watched as an object of curiosity, to-day they are a common mode of running round the city and touring the country. The reader will find some interesting information, giving full particulars of motor car tours, farther on in this book. The city cab and the city cab horse stand out in striking contrast to the antiquated tramcar and its overworked slave. Our cabs are smart, clean, and well driven, the horses well fed, groomed, and carefully tended, and no city in the world can boast of better vehicles. The annual picnic is one of the pleasant established halting places among the various industrial, commercial, social, and educational institu-

IN the compilation of "Adelaide: Queen City of the South," the author felt so forcibly the loss of an adequate guide, that he determined to fill in the blank and has, at considerable expense, time, and trouble, secured the best and most reliable information, setting forth the fullest particulars, not only giving numerous select pictures along the lines of tour, but the route to take, the distance the best means of travelling, and the cost and time of each trip. Much of the information has been gathered from the enterprising manager of the Adelaide Motor and Garage Works, he being found quite an expert on the subject matter dealt with. **By Special Arrangement** he has scheduled a scale of prices for motor trips which are not generally applicable outside the benefits offered the readers of this publication. For these trips 8 h.p. De Dion cars are provided, with experienced and careful drivers, and will carry three passengers. Tourists who are limited to time, and wish to see the most interesting parts of the suburbs only, can have a choice of many trips covering about 15 miles at a cost of 10s. 6d. per trip, particulars of which can be had by ringing up 'Phone 1532; but for those who have more time to spare, the Editor recommends any of the following trips, which will give the visitor an excellent idea of some of the prettiest country and scenery in Australia.

Waterfall Gully.

<p>Norton Summit. Motor return trip, 15/- Distance return, 19 miles.</p>	<p>This is a very pretty trip, via Kent Town, Maylands, Magill, then up pretty winding valleys among orchards and gardens, ever ascending till the summit is reached ; all the way the road and views are admirable, and for variety one can return via Fifth Creek.</p>
<p>Tea-Tree Gully. Motor return trip, 20/- Distance return, 24 miles.</p>	<p>This little village stands where once was a thicket of Ti-trees ; down Frome Road, via Lower North Adelaide, follow north-east, winding road among fields, gardens, and pretty villas, occasionally fringing Torrens river, till the Gully is reached ; return trip via Paradise, Magill, and Walkerville.</p>
<p>Happy Valley. Motor return trip, 20/- Distance return, 23 miles.</p>	<p>Run down Unley Park, round an old racecourse to main South Road, up Tapley's Hill (a pretty winding well-kept road), over the hill ; turn down through fields and pasture lands till reservoir is reached. Run around embankment and along shady track joining main South Road at the Hotel at the bottom of Tapley's ; back to City along main road through Goodwood.</p>
<p>The Gorge. Motor return trip, 15/- Distance return, 19 miles.</p>	<p>This is a pretty little spot up the Torrens river and takes its name from the close contact of the mountains on either side. At the Gorge a weir is constructed, making a storage for City water supply ; ornamental trees are planted along the line of aqueduct making shady and pleasant retreats. The road leads through Magill, Campbelltown, and Paradise, and then follows a pretty winding road along the river bank till the Gorge is reached. Hill climbers can find good ground for exercise at this spot, and rabbits are very plentiful.</p>
<p>Aldgate. Motor return trip, 25/- Distance return, 28 miles.</p>	<p>This is one of the most popular trips amongst the local residents. The beautiful hills are ascended along the most interesting and oldest track, passing Glen Osmond, Mountain Hut, Devil's Elbow, Eagle-on-the-Hill, Mount Lofty, Waverley Ridge, Crafers, and through Stirling to Aldgate, where one of the best Hotels is to be found. The views and road all the way are exceptionally good.</p>
<p>Reynella, Morphett Vale, Aldinga. Motor trip return to either place, 25/- Distance return to either place, 30 miles.</p>	<p>Among the trips on the South Road, following the line of coast, are Reynella, Morphett Vale, Aldinga, when for a little extra, the run back can be all through different country and scenery. It is one of the special advantages of touring around Adelaide, that the same road need not be traversed on the return trip. Good roads are everywhere, and intersect the country in all directions, and as a rule on the plains country, are straight and fringed with either the eucalyptus, the olive, or ornamental trees and shrubs.</p>

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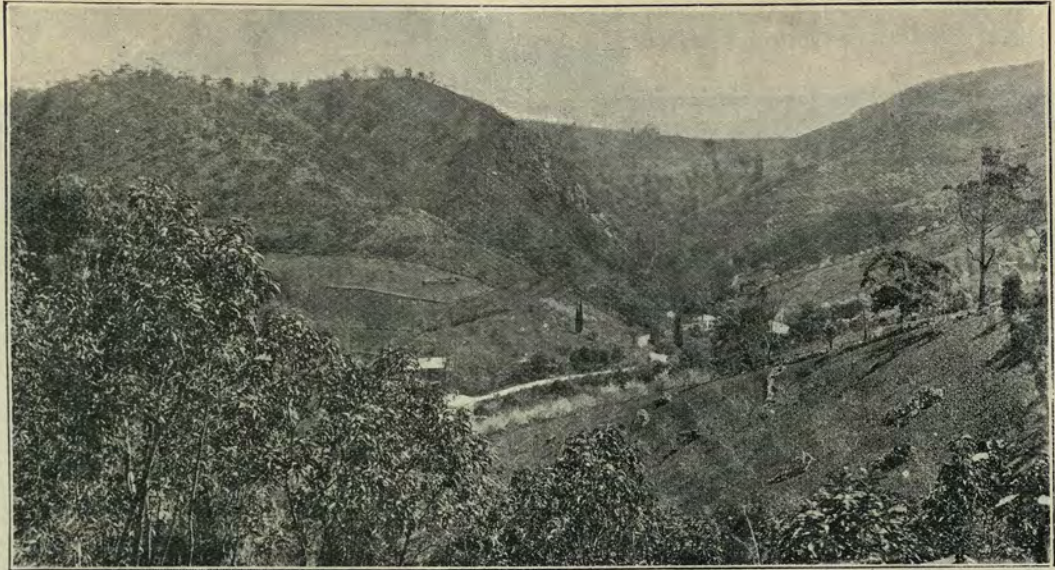

This is the popular hill trip, and one can rely on a most enjoyable day's outing. Passing through some of the grandest scenery in Australia, and traversing the finest made roads, proceed via Mavlands, Magill, Norton Summit, Summertown, Picadilly, and Crafers to Aldgate, where there is a good hotel, and then return via Stirling, Eagle-on-Hill, and Glen Osmond. Both going and coming back there are splendid views at nearly every turn of the road.

Clarendon.

Motor return trip,

Distance return, 40 miles.

This is another very popular trip—passing through Mitcham, mounting Belair Hill, Blackwood, then sweeping round Coromandel Valley and gradually dipping into the pretty little village of Clarendon. A good hotel is to be found here. Continue the journey for a few hundred yards to inspect the weir, from whence iron pipes conduct the water to Happy Valley reservoir.

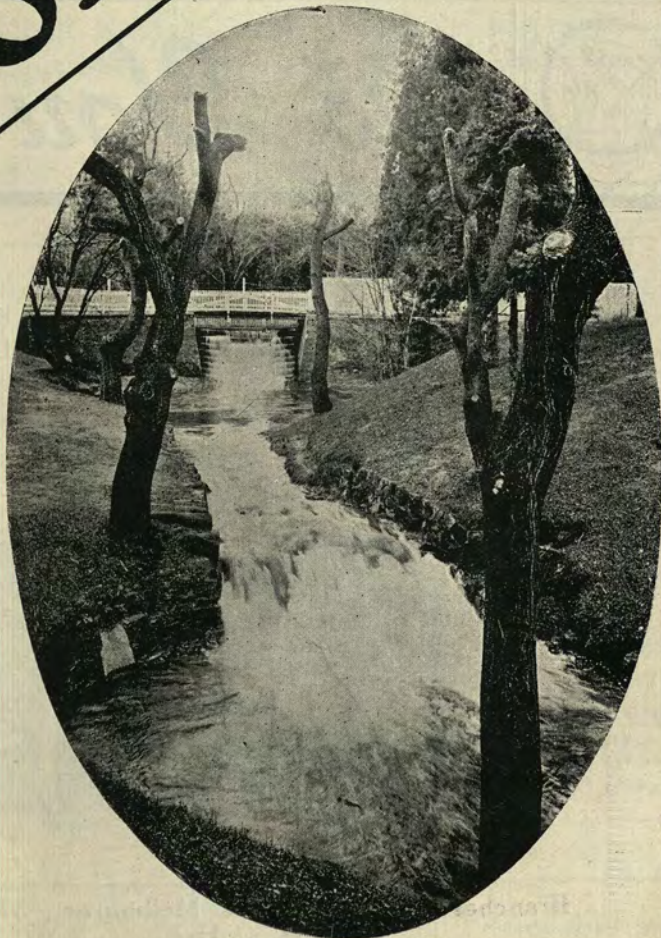

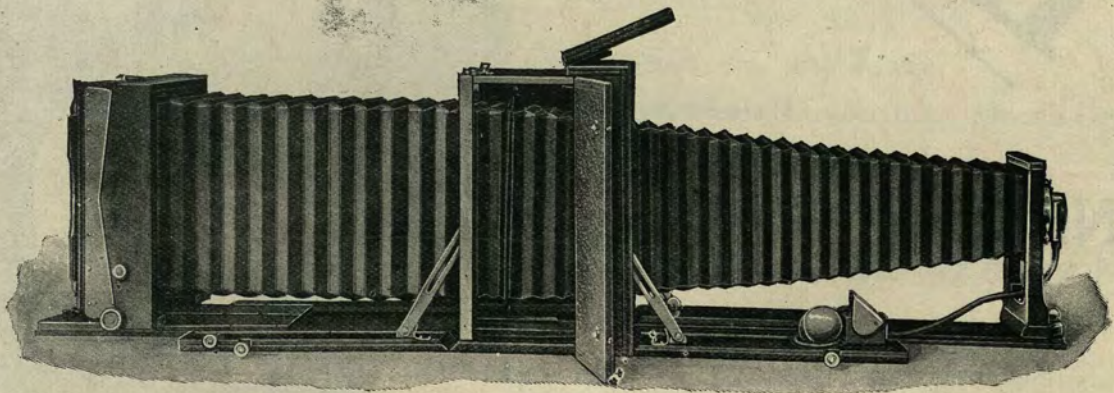
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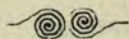

Would suggest starting about 9.30 a.m. This trip will give to visitors an excellent idea of some of the prettiest country in the State. The scenery is constantly changing and gives some of the most enchanting and delightful views. Running through Parkside we soon begin to ascend the winding road. From the Devil's Elbow we get splendid views of the city and suburbs. A halt is generally called at the Eagle-on-the-Hill, and refreshments partaken of. Once over Mount Lofty, a run of a few miles down a very pretty road and Aldgate is reached, a distance of about 14 miles from town. A first-class hotel is to be found here. Leaving Aldgate we have a few hills to climb, Bridgewater, Balhannah, Oakbank, and Hahndorf are passed, and then a pleasant run on a good road into Mount Barker. Stopping at Jackson's Hotel, a good dinner is always obtainable. The return journey can be made by an entirely different route, through Echunga, Macclesfield, Meadows, and Dashwood Gully—nearly all level running on beautiful roads—arriving at Clarendon about 4 o'clock for afternoon tea, which can be obtained at the hotel. Leaving Clarendon, a long hill is first encountered, and then a beautiful run down towards Blackwood, into Belair, and through National Park. From the top of Belair Hill another picturesque view of the city is obtainable, and thence homeward through Mitcham and Unley, arriving in town at 6 p.m. The distance covered is about 90 miles, and will never be forgotten. It is invigorating and will give you new life, and the Editor strongly recommends it.

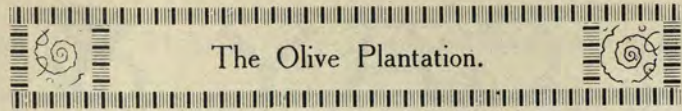

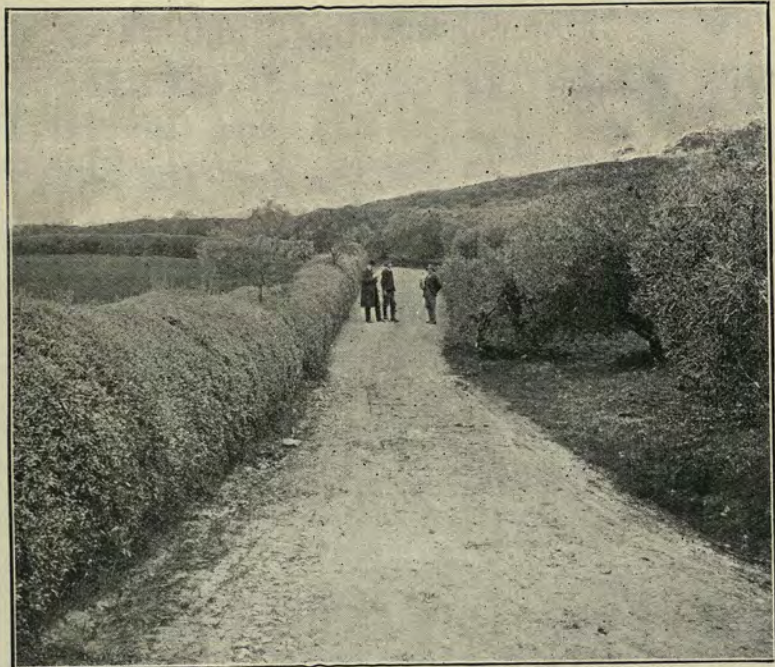

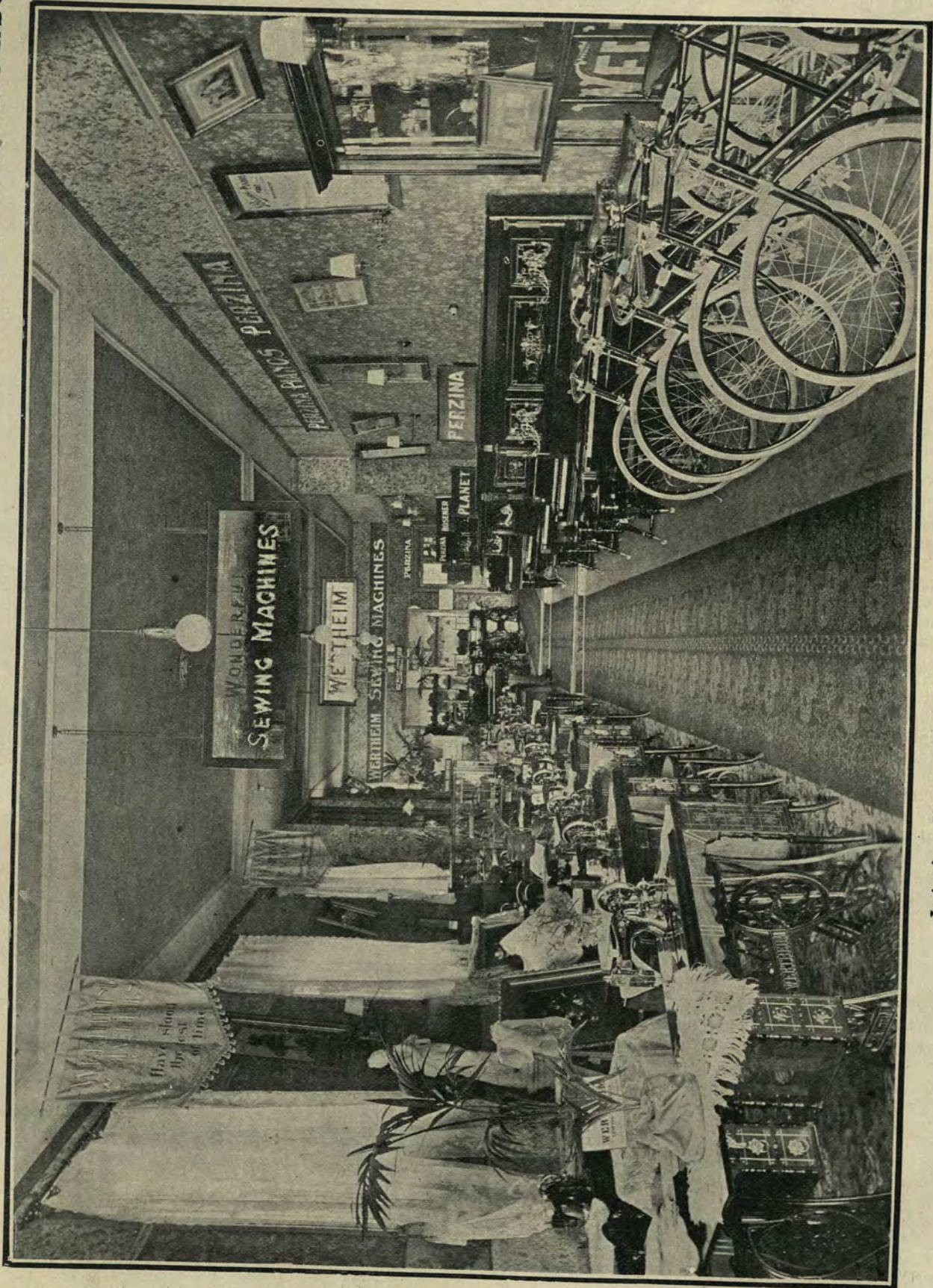

The Evening Journal.

THE REGISTER, the pioneer daily paper of South Australia, was founded by the late Robert Thomas and George Stevenson, in 1836. On June 26 of that year the first number of the paper was published in London

and on June 3, 1837, the second was printed in Hindley Street, Adelaide, Mr. Thomas having in the meantime brought out from England a staff of men and the plant of a printer. *The Observer*, a profusely illustrated weekly, was founded by Mr. John Stephens, in 1843, and in 1845 the two papers were united under the same management. *The Evening Journal* was founded in 1869. The proprietors of these journals are Messrs. Robert Kyffin Thomas, John Harvey Finlayson, William John Sowden, and Evan Kyffin Thomas. Two of above are grandsons of one of the founders, the designation of the firm being W. K. Thomas & Co.

THE ADVERTISER was first published on Monday, July 12, 1858, its founder and editor being the Hon. J. H. Barrow, M.P. The present editor and proprietor is the Hon. Sir Langdon Bonython, and most of the success which has been won by the paper and its associated publications is due to his energy, enterprise, and foresight. *The Chronicle* was founded at the same time as *The Advertiser*, and its earliest issue appeared on Saturday, July 17, 1858. Since then it has steadily grown in circulation and influence. *The Express*, the afternoon paper, began its existence on November 30, 1863, and on January 2, 1867, *The Telegraph*, the pioneer penny paper of Australia, was purchased and amalgamated with it.

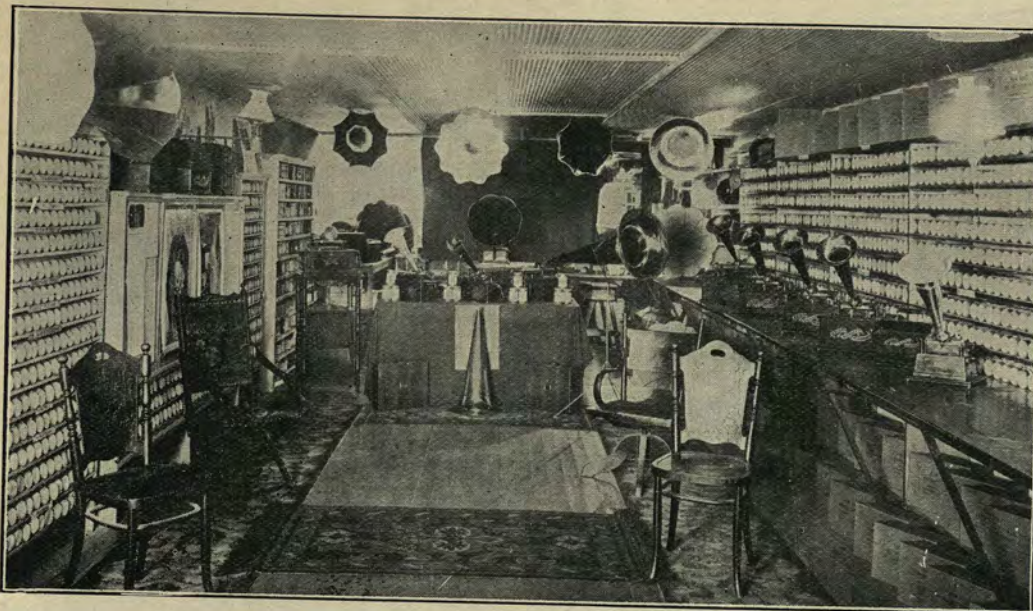

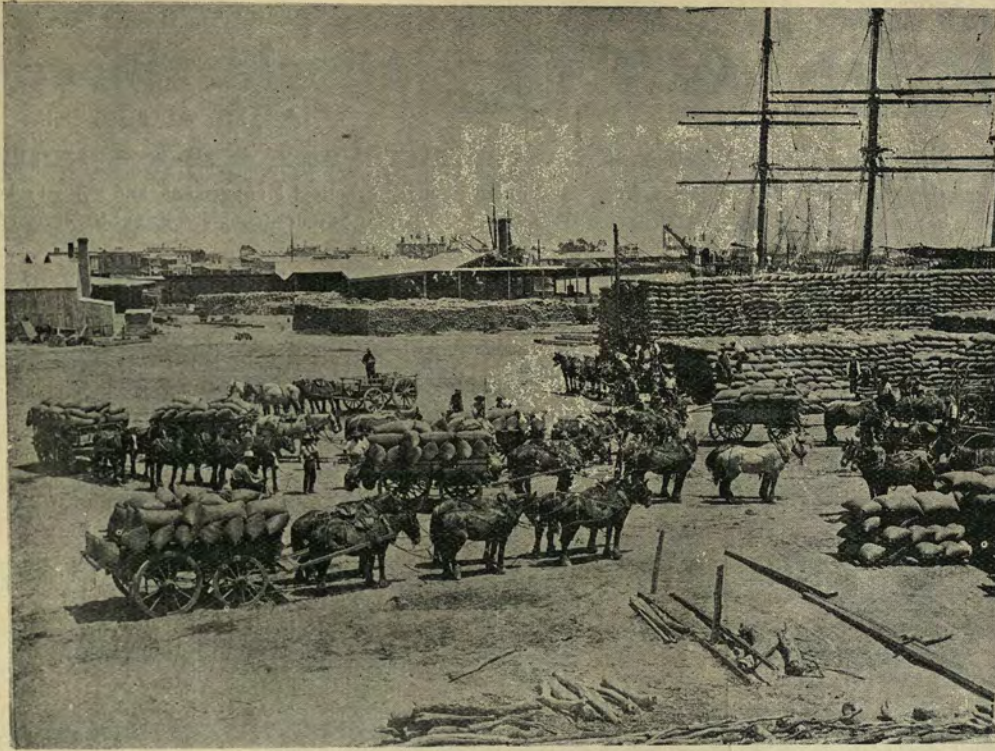

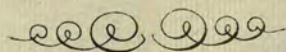


CATTLE-RAISING is gradually increasing in this State, year by year, the total number, including those of the Northern Territory,

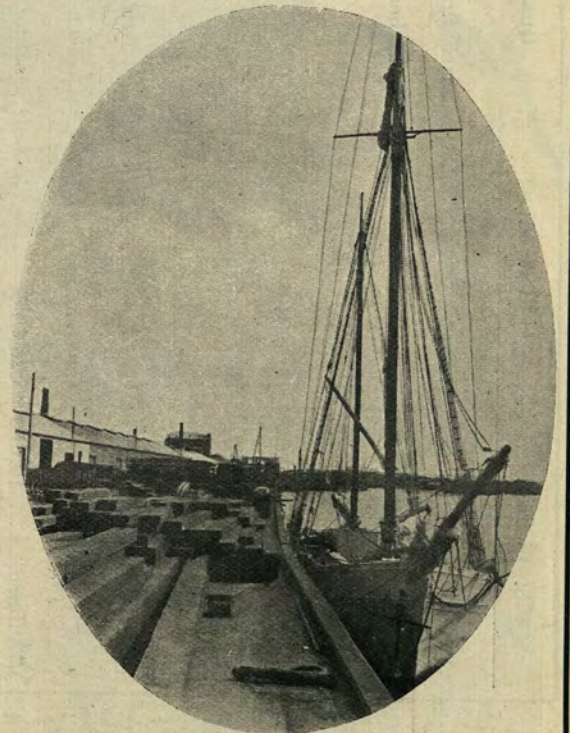

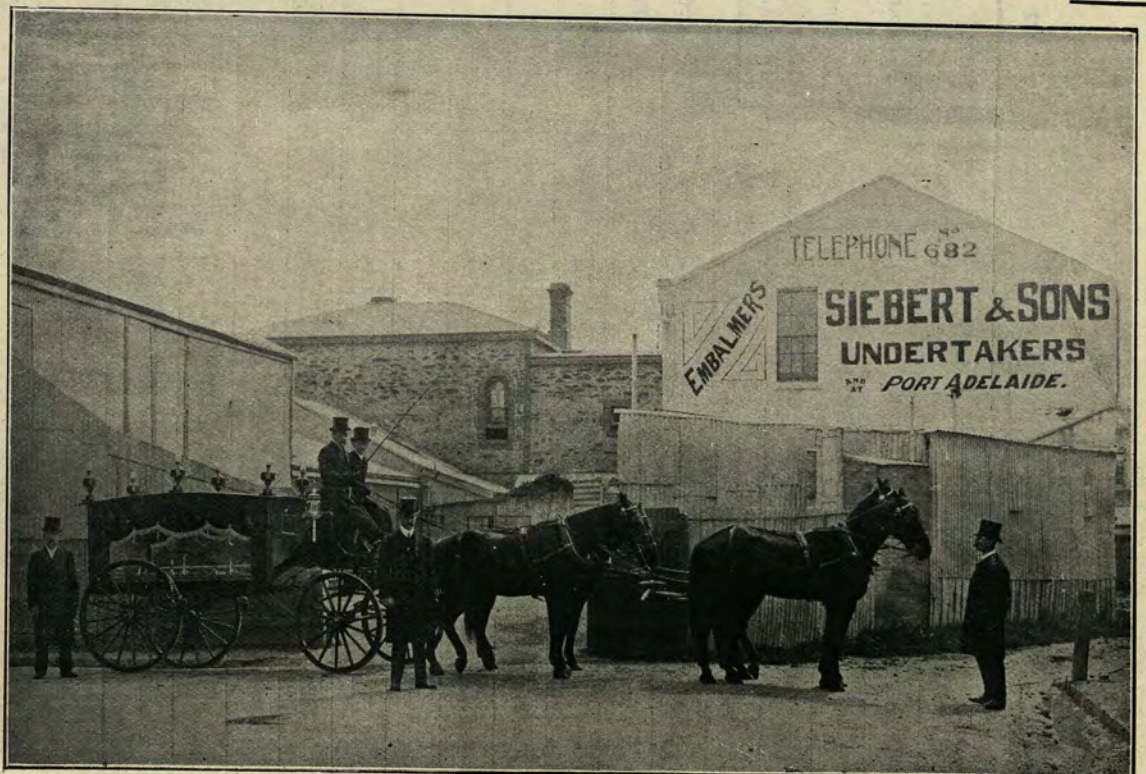
