UNIVERSITY IN THE COUNTRY.

MOONTA, December 21. On Friday evening, in the institute hall, the Registrar of the Adelaide University (Mr. Hodge) distributed the certificates won by local candidates at the recent examinations in connection with the Moonta centre of the Adelaide University. There was a large attendance. The President of the institute (Mr. H. W. Uffindell) occupied the chair, and delivered an appropriate address. The Registrar took advantage of the opportunity to explain the objects of the University, whose operations were perhaps not widely enough known outside of the city. He was pleased with the progress the Moonta centre was making, and this was to a large extent due to their energetic President (Mr. Uffindell), and to the indefatigable efforts of the secretary (Rev. B. Wibberley). When in 1897 the people of Moonta asked to have a centre established in their midst the council was pleased to grant the request. It was perhaps news to some to know that the first endowment the University had received (£20,000) came from the Moonta district. The secretary presented a statement, which showed that since the inauguration 262 candidates had sat for examination, 169 of whom had passed. This year 79 candidates sat, and 68.8 per cent. obtained certificates—a gratifying result, considering the high standard of the examinations. The Registrar handed the successful students their certificates, and was accorded a vote of thanks on the motion of Dr. T. James and Mr. W. Cowling. During the evening Miss G. Thomas contributed a violin selection, and Miss A. Rough a solo.
