

**ANGAS ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP.**

At the meeting of the University Senate on Wednesday approval was given to alterations in the regulations governing the Angas Engineering Scholarship. Under the new conditions the scholarship will be tenable for only two instead of three years, and the examinations are to be held biennially in March. The change will give the opportunity to a greater number of students to gain the distinction, and it has been brought about through the enlarged facilities for obtaining instruction in engineering within South Australia, so that a great deal of the work can now be done in the state which formerly had to be deferred until the student reached England.

It will be a great disappointment both to masters and scholars if the lists of passes are not available, to be read out at these demonstrations, more particularly as in a number of instances valuable scholarships, awarded by the public schools, are dependent upon the position taken by candidates in the "Junior," "Senior," or "Higher public" examinations. In the interest of many anxious youths and maidens, therefore, it is to be hoped that the examiners will do their best to have the results posted early. The task will be a hard one, for over a thousand papers have to be perused and marked in respect to some of the subjects taken.
