CONCERT IN AID OF POLISH CHILDREN.

By permission of the Council of the University of Adelaide a popular concert was given in the Elder Hall last night. It was in aid of the starving children of Poland, and was given by the staff and students of the Elder Conservatorium, with the assistance of Miss Merle Robertson. There was a large audience, and the programme had been compiled with extraordinary judgment, due, no doubt, to the capable management of Mr. George Pearce. Before the concert the Director of the Conservatorium announced that the occasion was the outcome of a personal request from Miss Ethel Cooper, a well-known Adelaide musician, now doing relief work in Poland. Dr. E. Harold Davies then introduced Dr. Armstrong Smith, who spoke of his personal experiences in Poland. He told a story of misery and ruin; of people having to make old German dugouts their homes; of fifteen families trying to exist in one large room. Dr. Smith asked each person to do all in his power to help. The Polish Government and the Society of Friends, in their immense undertaking of trying to better conditions for the unfortunate Polish children, needed the co-operation of everyone.
The combined talent of all sections of the institution was heard at this concert. The Conservatorium Student Orchestra, conducted by Professor E. Harold Davies, played Sir Walford Davies' "Solemn Melody," with Mr. Harold Wyld at the organ. Mr. Gerald Walenn's violin solos, both examples of his skill and deep musician, were the "Romance" from Wieniawski's concerto in D minor, and a "Mazurka" by the same composer. Mr. Walenn was forced to play an extra. Miss Merle Robertson appeared first as a composer-pianist in a solo entitled "An Appeal for Poland," and bracketed with her powerful playing several impersonations, which revealed her cleverness in this direction. The peculiarities and mannerisms of celebrities of such fame as Paderewski, Busoni, Pachmann, and Mark Hambourg, in the world of pianists, were remarkably clever. A duet as sung by Melba and Martinelli, showed that Miss Robertson might easily have excelled in vocal work. The versatile artist finished with some humor at the expense of Madame Delmar Hall, Mr. George Pearce, and the "Director at the organ," which convulsed the audience. Miss Hilda Gill sang two Rachmaninoff songs of great value. They were "At Night" and "Into My Open Window." The Conservatorium String Quartet, which included Mr. Gerald Walenn, Miss Nora Kyffin Thomas, Miss Sylvia Whittington, and Mr. Harold Parsons, played Frank Bridge's "Londonderry Air" and Percy Grainger's "Molly on the Shore." Miss Maude Puddy and Mr. William Silver were given a warm reception for their piano duo work in Saint-Saens' "Le rouet d'Omphale." Mr. H. Winslow Hall conducted the ladies' participating class in Schubert's "God in Nature." Mr. Harold Parsons was organist, and Miss Coralie Godfree acted as pianist. Mr. Frederick Bevan conducted the University Choral Class in the following numbers, "The Bells of St. Michael's Tower," by Knyvett-Stewart; Sullivan's "The Long Day Closes" and "Oh, Hush, Theo, My Babe"; "When the Wind Blows," by Bishop; and Eaton Fanning's "Vagabonds." Miss Ariel Shearer was the accompanist for the choir. Mr. Harold Parsons' fine equipment as violoncellist was shown through the "Hebrew Melody," by Granville Bantock, to which Mr. Harold Wyld added the organ part, which makes the work a duo for the two instruments. Mr. W. H. Foote conducted the Student Orchestra in a selection of Strauss "Waltzes," which fittingly concluded the programme. The accompanists were Mr. Harold Wyld and Mr. George Pearce.
