My dear Alf,

I have been wondering whether my few remaining years would not just as well be spent in Australia as elsewhere, and in particular in Adelaide though perhaps Hobart has the advantage in climate.

I wonder if you or Marion, having knowledge of the customs of the city, could tell me whether I could probably lodge in some private home with all found, for something like £10 a week. I would not like to live in college which, in some ways, is uncomfortable, and I suppose there may be quite desirable families who would be glad to have some additional income.

Another point is what steps I need to take in respect to naturalisation or citizenship. It may be complicated or it may be a simple matter of interview with your Department of Immigration.

Anyway I am writing to you first of all so as to be in a position to make a decision as soon as may be. You might let Henry Bennett know about this as I think he would be interested.
